UNCLE WALTER AND ETHEL PHELPS WILL PERFORM AT THE MARCH PROGRAM

The March program will be Uncle Walter and Ethel Phelps from Ashville, N.C. Uncle Walter is 80 years old and was born in the same year as another great blues singer, Gay Davis. Uncle Walter has played with Peg Leg Sam and Pink Anderson during their travels with the last two great medicine shows-Dr. Kerr's and Chief Thundercloud. He had a band in the 30's performing ragtime and jugband music. He will appear on a forthcoming record to be put out by the John Henery Anthology Foundation.

Ethel sings pop songs of the 20's and 30's including some Blind Boy Fuller material and some torch songs. She had a choir in the 30's which sang on WWNC - the same radio station that featured Jimmy Rodgers.

Together, they are dynamite! They tell stories, Walt may even do a dance or two, and they thoroughly enjoy themselves on stage as I'm sure you will too. As usual, the program is March 11 (the second Friday) at 8:30 PM at the Washington Ethical Society, 7750 16th St. NW (at Kalmia Rd.). Admission is FREE for FSGW members and \$2 for non-members. Once again we are pleased to announce that this program is being partially supported by a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts.

MICHAEL COONEY IS MARCH SPECIAL EVENT

Michael Cooney, one of the best known traditional singers in the country, will perform for the society on Saturday evening, March 19, at 8:30 PM at the Washington Ethical Society (address above). Admission will be \$2 for FSGW members and \$3 for the general public. To most members, Michael Cooney needs little introduction. He sings (English traditional, old-timey, blues, ragtime, etc.), plays (guitar, banjo, concertina, etc.), and performs as well as anyone in the current folk music revival. He has traveled throughout this country and abroad performing at just about every festival, club, and coffeehouse worth mentioning. He has recorded two albums, "The Cheese Stands Alone" on Folk Legacy and "Singer of Old Songs" on Front Hall. The titles pretty much tell the story. Come early to get a seat.

The March sing will be held Friday the 4th at the Washington Ethical Society, 7750 16th St. NW. Joanie "Baloney" Lakosky will lead "Songs of impetuous youth and wizened old age" or more broadly songs of old and young people. Singing starts around 9 PM and the \$1 admission includes refreshments.
