Open Sing

Open sings are a chance to get together, relax, and enjoy a good sing. The mood is friendly and informal. Generally twenty to thirty people show up and arrange themselves in a loosely defined circle, some on chairs, some on the floor, some stretched out. A different leader each month chooses a suggested topic for the upcoming sing. At the sing, the leader gets things started and we go one way or the other or randomly round the circle so that each person attending has an opportunity to sing or suggest a song that can be related to the topic, however circuitously. (It is also permitted to sing or suggest a song and challenge the other people there to relate it to the topic for you!). After the first round we traditionally have a five minute visiting break for ten minutes and are back in fifteen to have at least another round or two of singing until we all get too sleepy. We've had topics from "Heroes & Villains", "Changes", and "Women", to "Chorus Songs" and "Follow the Leader" where you try to relate your song to the song that was sung immediately before yours. Whatever the topic, we all have fun and singers from professional quality to "I just came to listen" are welcome.

Open sings are held first Friday of each month at the WES Auditorium, 7750 16th St., N.W. We begin around 8:30 p.m. Admission is \$3.00 per person to cover the cost of the hall, and we bring our own refreshments. During the summer this year we changed format a bit to meet in members' homes. But we will be back at WES in October.

Tommy Sands & Pat Kilbride - September Program September 8, 8:30pm



The September FSGW Program, Friday, Sept. 8, at 8:30pm in the Auditorium of the Washington Ethical Society, features two great Irish musicians, Tommy Sands & Pat Kilbride.

Tommy Sands' career has spanned nearly 20 years, generated 15 albums & seen him headlining appearances with his siblings in Europe & the U.K. He is an outstanding performer, a committed social activist, & one of Ireland's most powerful songwriters. His best-known song, "There Were Roses," is a ballad on the futility of sectarian violence; it already has become a folk classic. It can be heard on his album Singing of the Times (Green Linnet SIF 3044). Down by Bendy's Lane, Tommy's magical recording of Irish songs & stories for children of all ages (Green Linnet CSIF 1085) is fast becoming a family

favorite. Sands plays guitar, bodhran, tim whistle & banjo. He is also a storyteller of tra-

ditional Irish tales. Pete Seeger says, "Tommy Sands has achieved that difficult but wonderful balance between knowing & loving the traditions of his home & being concerned with the future of the whole world."

Pat Kilbride is originally from County Kildare & recently moved to the U.S. A former member of the popular Scottish group the Battlefield Band, Kilbride has been acclaimed as "one of Ireland's finest guitarists." He is also a fine singer whose heartfelt interpretations of both traditional & contemporary songs have broad appeal. His inventive arrangements combine diverse musical influences (jazz, classical, African & middle eastern, rock & roll, & -of course- traditional Celtic music). In addition to Ireland, Pat has lived in Brittany & Brussels. Frequent concert & festival appearances won him an enthusiastic following in Europe, where he continues to tour quite regularly. More Rock and Roses, Kilbride's new recording (CD & cassette only--on Flying Fish) will be released in the U.S. this fall.




