

FSGW MINI FEST Takoma Park Intermediate School Saturday, January 30

The Folklore Society of Greater Washington Mini-Fest, a family event, will be held on Sat. Jan. 30th, at the Takoma Park Intermediate School, 7611 Piney Branch Rd., Takoma Park, MD. Folk performers, crafts people, and support staff will be volunteering to make this benefit for the FSGW more successful than ever. The line-up is a promising mix of old friends and new faces.

AFTERNOON EVENTS 12 noon to 6 pm

During the afternoon there will be dance workshops including Cajun, Balkan, Swing, African, Contras and Vintage dances. A special children's area will feature entertainment engrossing to both adults and children including Mark Jaster, mime extraordinaire; Bill Jenkins' "The World of Music"; George Rathbone's fantasy experience "Going on an Adventure" and puppeteers Jenny and Joe Leotta. Popular events from previous years include chorus songs (Judy Cook), a gospel sing (Joel Bailes), Balkan vocal jam (Svirala), and Dick Rodgers' "Remember the Sixties". There will be thematic workshops on song writing (Sid Rosenberg), Woody Guthrie (Reuben Musgrave), "Love Me, loves Me Not" (Grace Griffth), hillbilly (Chance Shiver), and Jewish sabbath table songs (Charlie Blum).

For the instrumentally inclined, there will be a blues jams (Judy Luiz), a "slow jam" (Dennis Cook), Bruce Hutton will lead a workshop on accompanying fiddle tunes and Karen Collins will host a workshop on Cajun music. There will be several mini-concerts through out the afternoon featuring many local favorite performers.

Ed and Jane Hyland have agreed to demonstrate spinning and weaving techniques. Martha Mikaska will show how to create a necklace with beads from around the world. As always, Debby McClatchy will be providing wonderful veggie and non-veggie meals.

EVENING EVENTS 7:30pm to 10pm

An evening concert from 7:30 pm to 10:00 pm features the Double Decker String Band, champions of old-time country music; Sharon Butler, a spellbinding teller of stories from around the world; Jeff Warner, a fount of traditional American song and vocalists, Lisa Moscatiello, Marcy Marxer, and Grace Griffith. Concurrent with the evening concert there will be a contra dance called by John Krumm with music by Bruce Molsky and the Screaming L-7's. You may attend the concert and dance for one admission.

The Takoma Park Intermediate School is a short walk from the Takoma station on Metro's Red Line. A connecting Montgomery County Ride-on bus will bring you nearly to the door.

All day admission for adults is \$10 for FSGW members and \$12 for non-members. Half-day admission (for either the afternoon or evening sessions) is \$6 for members and \$8 for non-members. Children ages 5 to 16 are half price and children under 5 will be admitted free. There is a family maximum rate of \$30 for members and \$36 for non-members for the whole day.

A native of Edinburgh, Scotland, Ed Miller is no stranger to FSGW audiences, who have another chance to hear this songster, folklorist, teacher, raconteur, geographer, and musical tour guide in an 8:30 pm house concert at the Silver Spring, MD home of Jennifer Woods and Bob Clayton on Saturday, January 23.

The fact that he has lived in Austin, Texas for over 20 years has not lost Ed Miller either his accent, his love of his native land, nor his treasure trove of songs. In fact, he is more in touch with the folk revival on both sides of the Atlantic than most performers, and has the wonderful ability to imbue traditional songs with a newness


and new songs with a sense of timelessness. His voice is strong, smooth and sure, his guitar playing sensible and sensitive, and his bag of songs tremendous. A measure of his ability is his winning of the top prize for unaccompanied male singer in the annual competition held by the Traditional Music and Song Association of Scotland for 1992, despite his long absence from Scotland. Perhaps he sang one of the traditional Scots songs from his Folk Legacy recording, or perhaps he just sang them "West Texas Waltz." With Ed Miller, the possibilities are endless.



The 11th Chesapeake Spring Dance Weekend April 16 - 18, 1993

Once again, Chesapeake brings in the Spring with great music and dance. As usual we will have a mix of New England contras and squares, southern squares, step dance and something else - Eastern European dance. This year's staff brings together some of the best musicians and callers from the East Coast, the West coast and the great in-between. Evening dances Friday and Saturday, workshops all day Saturday and Sunday, great food, a beautiful location by the Chesapeake Bay and the company of other dancers make this an annual dance treat.

Staff

Tony Parkes, organizer of Boston's Monday night Scouthouse dance, is widely known as one of the finest New England callers. Tony will be calling New England contras and squures in a rare Mid-Atlantic appearance. The Rod Miller Band band brings together some of the most talented dance musicians of the East and West Coasts for contra dance standards, inspired improvisations, and original tunes. They are Rod Miller (fiddle), Paul Kotapish (mandolin and guitar), Daniel Steinberg (piano and flute), David Cahn (bass).

Sandy Silva - Last year Sandy wowed everyone with her energy, her teaching and her incredible step dancing. She'll be back this year to demonstrate and teach her unique approach to clogging, percussive dance and rhythms for feet, hands and body. Ruthie Dornfeld has joined us in the past to play great music for square and contra dancing. This year she'll be playing for Sandy from her repertoire of American and international tunes of every description, style and time signature.

The four-piece, acoustic Horseflies will return to play rhythmic southern music for squares and clogging. Judy Hyman (fiddle), Jeff Claus (guitar), Richie Stearns (banjo), John Hayward (bass). Frank Hall's easy-going personality and great square dance calling have been a hit at major dance camps throughout the country. Frank will join us for southern squares, contras and additional workshops.

Zlatne Uste, formed in 1983, is a ten-piece folk brass band in the style of those common in Bulgaria and the former Yugoslavia. They have played dance music for performances at Carnegie Hall, dance camps such as NEFFA and at lamb roasts up and down the East coast. Their music can be bright, fast and showy or slow, deliberate and soulful - it is always exciting and danceable. Larry Weiner is one of the country's foremost experts in traditional dance music of the Balkan peninsula. He has made numerous field trips to the former Yugoslavia, Bulgaria and northern Greece to record and film traditional music and dance. A superb teacher and excellent dancer, Larry has a knack for making the dances and rhythms accessible and fun for dancers at all experience levels.

CAMP LETTS

Located in Edgewater, Maryland, ten miles from Annapolis and 34 miles from Washington, D.C., Camp Letts is on a peninsula created by two rivers flowing into the Chesapeake Bay. The camp is owned and operated by the YMCA on the grounds of a former estate. The main dances will be held in the spacious wooden-floored dance hall overlooking the waterfront. This building doubles as the dining hall for delicious meals prepared by our caterer, Barbara Kline. Smaller workshops will be held in other buildings on the camp grounds. We also have access to other camp facilities including walking trails, tennis courts, athletic fields, boating, and horseback riding (modest fee). Cabins are dormitory style, sleeping 8-12 persons to a room. Tenting is optional (BYOT).

Registration

Send in the application form with a self-addressed-stamped envelope, a check and your decorated name tag. The cost for the weekend is \$125 which includes program costs, sleeping accomodations (participants supply own bedding) use of other camp facilities, and five delicious meals. A number of \$70 scholarships are available in exchange for 5 hours of work in the kitchen. Cancellations received by April 14 will receive \$110 refund. Check-in at camp begins 4 PM on Friday, the program concludes at 3:30 Sunday.

Attendance at the weekend is limited. Camp has filled up very quickly in the past so early registration is recommended. Applications will be accepted in order of receipt - adult, full-time registrations only. We will maintain a balance of men and women, singles and couples. Once your application is accepted, you will be sent a confirmation, schedule, information about what to bring and directions to camp.
