Irish Breakfast Band

Saturday February 6 • 8pm

The Irish Breakfast Band is a diverse group of DC, Northern Virginia and Maryland residents who get together every Saturday morning for a potluck breakfast and rehearsal of an extensive repetoire of Celtic tunes. A Child-Friendly band, the group often brings extra percussion instruments to give young audience members a chance to participate.

Watch for band leader **Sean Doherty** with his distinctive floppy hat and blonde fiddle, or **Chuck Moran** in the loud shirt sitting behind the bodhran or up front singing a rowdy song or two. The guy behind the blue bass is **Brandon Brylawski**, though he's been known to play guitar as well, and the lady behind the dulcimer is **Sue McIver. Lisa Anderson** and **Becky Bates** play flute and whistles and **Sandy Hoar** and **Kathy Gillcrist** provide rythym guitar. On mandolin are "A Pair of Bobs" (Feeney and Weinhagen) and Grace Drucker. **Karen Helbrecht** brings banjo, bouzouki and cello into the mix and fiddler **Gordon Johnston** also fills in with bouzouki and guitar. Vocalist **Jan** illuminates traditional Irish songs with a little back up from the other musicians.



FSGW Sacred Harp Singing Sunday February 28 • 3:30pm

FSGW sponsors monthly singings of early American hymns, anthems, and fuging tunes in four-part harmony. The main tunebook is The Sacred Harp, 1991 Edition, but Christian Harmony (Deason-Parris revision) is also used, and original shape-note compositions by local singers are frequently sung. These singings are held every fourth Sunday afternoon (except in December) and also on New Year's Day. We usually sing until about 6:30, then share a potluck supper. All are welcome to come and sing or listen for as long as desired. Loaner tunebooks are available. Admission is free. (At some church locations a free-will offering is taken.)

27th Mini Fest Evening Events

The evening events feature an outstanding concert and a spirited dance, which occur simultaneously. One admission allows folks to enjoy as much of either activity as time will allow, so drift into the concert hall (cafeteria) when the dance bands take a break, or slip away from the concert to shake a leg in a contra, square dance, or western swing.

The concert opens with **The Oklahoma Twisters**, a small but talented aggregation dedicated to keeping the Western Swing spirit of Bob Wills and the Texas Playboys alive. Featuring fiddle, steel guitar, lead and rhythm guitars, bass, drum and vocals, the Twisters do a top-notch job on old standbys, but also dust off some more obscure tunes.

Following the Twisters will be local songster **Reuben Musgrave**, whose warm voice and tuneful guitar picking have enlivened many an evening at local DC area folk clubs and Washington Folk Festivals. Reuben says he prides himself on finding "buried gems" in the repertoires of today's singers and songwriters. A songwriter of considerable talent himself, Reuben always seeks to put the song first, and strives to place each song in a setting that can "show it off" in the best light.

Grace Griffith makes one thing clear in her first nationally distributed album, *GRACE*; she's an eloquent and passionate singer who is true to her name - graceful. In her native Washington, D.C. area, she has been named "Best Female Vocalist" (in both the Celtic and Traditional Folk categories) for each of the last four years, by the Washington Area Music Association. A member of the celtic combo *Connemara* as well as a solo performer and songwriter, Grace brings great variety and skill to her performances, and a sense of commitment to the music and the tradition.

Or, if you really need to dance, enjoy the calling of **Robbin Schaffer** with *Alexander's Reel Time Band*, and, as the dance goes on, enjoy the Western Swing sounds of the *Oklahoma Twisters* as they do double duty!

Come for the whole day, from noon to 10:30 pm or just for part of the day!

Glen Echo Park Update

(This item appears monthly in order to provide FSGW members with a quick and easy way to stay current on the status of the National Park Service (NPS) plans for Glen Echo Park)

We are still awaiting the NPS announcement of its preferred scenario for Glen Echo Park management and operation. We now expect to see this scenario sometime in February, as the NPS "fleshes out" the original five scenarios and includes the Montgomery County plan. There will then be another public comment period and a decision probably in the summer of 1999.

The Montgomery County group continues to work to get matching funds ensured by the state of Maryland and federal government for one-third of approximately \$19 million in renovation costs. You can help, especially if you do not live in Montgomery County, by letting your Maryland State and federal Congressional representatives know you support the county plan and funding arrangement. If you reside outside of Maryland, it is especially important that Congressional representatives hear from you to show that this national park is not just of interest to Marylanders. All letters, calls and visits help.


