Eccentric and Funny Original Songs Thursday, January 16 • 8 pm

The Berrymans are two of the wittiest songwriters since Flanders and Swann. Peter writes clever and original lyrics, which Lou sets to unforgettable melodies. None of your simpering navel-gazing—these are songs you'll want to learn and sing for yourself, even if that means finding a duet partner (and it often does!). Peter accompanies their songs

on twelve-string guitar, while Lou's instrument can perhaps be best described as an accordion on a stick.

Lou and Peter Berryman began their musical partnership in high school in Appleton, Wisconsin, way back in the sixties. Their friendship survived a brief marriage in the seventies. By the eighties, they had established themselves as a prominent feature of the songwriting subculture of Wisconsin's capital, playing original material every week for almost ten years in the run-down but trendy music room of Madison's Club de Wash.

Gradually expanding their circuit, they began to crisscross the continent and gained national attention with appearances on such programs as Public Radio's A Prairie Home Companion and NPR's Weekend Edition. They

continue to make regular appearances at festivals and folk music clubs, performing songs from their twelve recordings and | Inside: three songbooks.

The popularity of **Lou and Peter Berryman** is a testament to their intelligent and wickedly funny material, never bawdy or risqué but always rich with wordplay and witty images. Their whimsical and wonderfully accessible performances of their hilarious, quirky, yet oddly profound songs will have your cheeks aching from smiling.



Mortheastern American Indian Lore and Learning

Saturday, January 18 • 8 pm
The featured performers for the monthly free FSGW program, to be held at the Washington Ethical Society auditorium, will be Missisquoi Abenaki Indian Marge Bruchac and her husband, Justin Kennick. This family-friendly program will offer traditional and contemporary Abenaki Indian songs and stories, accompanied with hand drums, rattles, and flute.

Marge specializes in researching, interpreting, and performing the history, music, and oral traditions of northeastern Algonkian Indian peoples. Her warm voice, along with Justin's harmonies and whistle tunes, enlivens Native trickster tales, origin stories and lesson stories to intrigue, teach, and entertain listeners of all ages. Marge and Justin bring the ancient voices to life and share historical anecdotes about the interactions between Algonkian peoples and New England colonists

As an historical consultant for several New England museums over the past 14 years, Marge has designed and presented numerous lectures, teacher training workshops, exhibits, curricula, and staff training programs. In 2000, she was selected "Storyteller of the Year" by the Wordcraft Circle of Native Writers and Storytellers. In 2001, she was profiled by Yankee Magazine in the article: "I Still Live: the Survival of New England's Native Tribes." Her most recent work is a book written for Plimoth Plantation and the National Geographic Society: 1621: A New Look at Thanksgiving.

Working together as *Hand in Hand*, Marge and Justin have performed at festivals throughout the northeastern U.S., Canada, and northern Europe, including the First Nations Festival in Montreal, Old Songs Festival, Mystic Seaport Sea Music Festival, Pinewoods Folk Music Camp, the Champlain Valley Festival, and the Oost-Friesland Folk Fest in Germany. They have also completed two performance tours of the Netherlands and Germany.

Marge's recordings include: Abenaki Heritage Festival and Alnobak with The Dawnland Singers. Their recording, Zahkiwi Lintowoganal/Voices in the Woods features original and traditional compositions of Abenaki music and stories.

Mike Agranoff is a troubadour who collects songs from wherever he can find them. As one of the founding forces behind the Folk Project in New Jersey and its Minstrel Coffeehouse, he gets exposed to a lot of music, and with a critical ear retains the best of it, from both tradition-bearers and

singer/songwriters. He can write wicked parodies and clever recitations, but is also capable of examining the heartbreak of the Gypsy Davy, one year later. He can sing a cappella, but also accompanies himself with intricate fingerstyle guitar picking, or perhaps a soulful concertina.

Mike Agranoff is a tall skinny guy with a graying red beard who travels about the Northeast with a driving need to make folk music happen. Because he's interested in sharing songs, the concert will be followed by a chance to sing around until Kathie Mack throws us out (at some late hour).

Geoff Kaufman is perhaps known best as a rousing singer of sea songs. He's been the chanteyman at Mystic Seaport in Connecticut, as well as its Foreman of Interpretive Music Programs and Director of the annual Sea Music Festival. Sometimes he's even the tenor in the Forebitter quartet.

In addition to his mania for maritime music, he is a passionate environmentalist, with an entire album of songs for the Earth to his credit. And he hasn't forgotten his childhood, spent on a dairy farm in the Catskill Mountains of New York. He recently produced a CD of music from that region entitled *Folk Songs of the Catskills*.



Ballads, Songs, and Stories C from Scotland



Friday, January 17 • 8 pm

When we heard that **Norman Kennedy** was coming to town for some weaving workshops in Waterford, we couldn't resist asking him to do a concert for FSGW. **Norman Kennedy** is an incomparable unaccompanied singer of traditional Scottish songs. Originally from Aberdeen, he learned his songs naturally by growing up around some of the great Scottish singers of the last generation. His extraordinary repertoire of songs was learned directly from these singers, without tapes or records. He learned them, not because he wanted to be a folk singer, but because even as a boy he was drawn to the music.

His concerts resemble informal conversations with the audience. In a relaxed moment he'll slide into an old song and when he's finished, before you realize it's over, he will describe where it's come from and how he learned it. His dry sense of humor and memory of the stories surrounding the songs make you appreciate not only the old songs, but the old ways as well. "You can tell stories, you can recite them, you can sing them," he says. Singing and recollecting are all part of the same cloth. With this directness he presents ballads —stories of love won and lost, betrayal, death — in a way that holds everyone's attention. As Norman explains it: "These songs are my roots; they're older and more important than I am."

There is no finer source still alive for traditional Scottish song and culture than Norman Kennedy.

Mini-Fest Countdown Continues! Saturday, February 15



Molly is primarily an American singer; originally from West Virginia, she focuses on those intensely beautiful mountain ballads. **Melissa** sings mostly English, Irish and Scots songs and ballads. They've been singing together for more than fifteen years —particularly Sacred Harp and other hymns in two parts — and have a tremendous blend.

Molly Andrews is a fine interpreter of traditional music as well as an outstanding vocalist in other styles. She brings a directness and intensity to everything she sings. Her repertoire centers on Appalachian ballads, early American hymnody, and rounds, bur she has been known to bring her soulful, expressive voice to jazz and pop standards. She has recorded with many fine artists; her last FSGW appearances were with guitarist **Duck Baker**.

Melissa Weaver Dunning is a singer of traditional ballads and songs from England, Ireland and Scotland. Her powerful and clear unaccompanied singing brings the old story songs to life and weaves vibrant pictures of life in another age. She has performed throughout the Eastern US and in the British Isles and France. A resident of Berryville, Virginia, Melissa and her husband Peter work together to run the Bluemont Concert Series. Melissa sang with Vermont's Word of Mouth Chorus; she was the founder and leader of Jubilo, a community shape note singing group, and currently sings with the a cappela women's trio Sine Nomine, which specializes in European sacred and secular music of the 10th to 15th centuries.

The film Festival opened at the Playhouse Theater. These events were reported in issues of Bluegrass Unlimited, Dick Cerri Newsletter, and Washington Star.



DIRECTIONS TO FREQUENT VENUES:

Washington Ethical Society (WES)

Auditorium. 7750 16th St., NW, just south of the intersection of Kalmia Rd. and 16th St., about four blocks inside the DC/MD line.

From the Beltway: Take the Georgia Avenue South exit. Stay in either right lane. Go 0.4 miles from the exit ramp, where the right lanes curve and put you on 16th St South. Follow 16th past East-West Hwy (Rte 410); cross the MD/DC line at Portal Dr. Kalmia Road is the first traffic signal south of the line, and WES is the second building on the right after you cross Kalmia. You may park on Kalmia Road by turning right at the light, or on either side of 16th St.



Bumper Car Pavilion, Glen Echo Park. 7300 MacArthur Blvd. at Goldsboro Rd, in Glen Echo, MD. The Bumper Car Pavilion is located just past and to the right of the carousel. (To the left of the under-construction Spanish Ballroom).

From the Beltway:

MARYLAND SIDE: at 2-lane Exit 40 take the left fork for Cabin John Parkway. Where Cabin John merges with Clara Barton Pkwy, move into the left lane, under the overhang.

VIRGINIA SIDE: get into the far right hand lane at the top of the bridge. At the first fork, bear right. Stay in the left lane; watch for Cabin John traffic merging from the right at the overhang.

MD/VA: Watch for signs to MacArthur Blvd. Make a very sharp hairpin turn and move immediately into the right lane. At the T intersection/stop sign, turn left onto MacArthur Blvd. Upper parking lot on the left. For lower parking lot, go around the small traffic circle and make the first left onto Oxford St.

By public transportation: Take the #29 bus from the Friendship Heights Metro Station. Ask the driver to let you know when to get off for Glen Echo Park. The bus stops running before the dance ends. Ask the dance coordinator to announce you need a ride. We've never left anybody at the park. Last bus leaves Friendship Heights Metro at 7:30 pm.




