
Brian Peters

them. His specialty is the great ballads of the British Isles.



Ivo Papazov Yuri Yunakov Reunion Tour





For the first time in 12 years world class Romani clarinetist Ivo Papazov and saxophonist Yuri Yunakov are performing together. They will be joined by Nesho Neshev on accordion, Salif Ali ("Sasho") on drum set, and Carol Silverman on vocals. Their ensemble performs Romani (Gypsy) music from the Balkan countries of Bulgaria, Macedonia, Serbia, and Turkey-music renowned for haunting melodies, complex rhythms, and stunning improvisations. The geographical position of the Balkans and hundreds of years of Ottoman Turkish rule have created a wealth of influences from both East and West. They play in a contemporary style called "wedding music," aptly named for its ubiquitous presence at life cycle celebrations such as weddings, baptisms, and circumcisions where dancing and music are a requirement.

The ensemble will present both instrumental and vocal music from contrasting regions of the Balkans performed in the Bulgarian and Romani languages. Songs express the experiences of village and urban living and the joys and sorrows of life among Roma.

The repertoire highlights the popular dance form kjuchek, and songs reflecting the marginalization of Roma from mainstream society.

The leading members of the ensemble, Yuri, Ivo, Nesho, and Salif, have played together since the 1970's. Carol Silverman (vocals) has been involved with Balkan and Romani music and culture for over twenty years as a researcher, teacher, and performer, and teaches Balkan music nationally.



Wyndham=Read Songs of the Australian Outback Thursday, October 9 • 8pm



A native of England, Martyn Wyndham-Read became interested in folksongs of the Australian outback while working on an Australian sheep station in the early 1960's. There he fell in love with Australia and its music.

He learned old songs directly from drovers, cane cutters and other bush-workers. As the folk song revival gathered momentum in Australia, Martyn found himself singing these songs to audiences across Australia. After seven years down under, he returned to England where he performed to an appreciative British audience.

To date his recording career spans 33 years and more than 30 albums, many considered classics of their genre. One of the most engaging performers you're ever likely to see, his exceptionally intimate performances combine songs, humorous bush poetry, stories and anecdotes of outback life and Australian culture that typically leave the audience ready to book the next flight to Sydney!

For years Carl Jones and Beverly Smith have appeared on the traditional music scene, playing at festivals, contests and dances in various bands and formations. Carl toured with Norman and Nancy Blake as part of the Rising Fawn String Ensemble playing mandolin, banjo, and fiddle. He often plays as a duo with James Bryan, and is sometimes found pickin' as part of a trio with **Bruce Green** and **Don Pedi**. Carl has been an instructor at Pinewoods, Port Townsend's Festival of American Fiddle Tunes, Mars Hill Old Time Week, and the Swannanoa Gathering. One of the most respected guitar players in old time music today, Beverly Smith is also in demand as a singer, fiddler, and dance caller. She has made numerous recordings, backing up fiddlers Bruce Molsky, Rafe Stefanini, Tara Nevins and Brad Leftwich; vocalizing with Irish musicians Mick Moloney and John Doyle; and also singing with bluegrass great Laurie Lewis. She has taught and played at many camps and folk festivals and, in addition to her collaboration with Carl, plays with old time band *The Rockinghams*.





35 Years Ago This Month - October 1968

The October 11, 1968 FSGW program at the Washington Ethical Society featured Irish singer **Joe Heaney**. (**Joe Hickerson's** *Washington Star* review of this concert was quoted at length in the December 16, 1968, issue of The Irish Times and in subsequent newspapers in Ireland.) The Open Sing was held October 25 at the Union Methodist Church.

A 15 page newsletter supplement featured an article by **Esther Birdsall** entitled "Maryland Folklore Recorded in Maryland: A Guide to the Old Line State," in addition to reviews of books, LPs and festivals.

The following were also scheduled to appear in the area this month: Glenn Yarborough (Catholic University); Fiesta Mexicana, Uday Shankar Hindu Dancers & Musicians (Constitution Hall); Helen Schneyer, Joe Latham Trio (Alexandria Market Place); Benny & Vallie Cain & The Country Clan (Maple Restaurant); Country Gentlemen (Shamrock; Green Acres Country Music Club); Currie Family (Bonanza Sirloin Pit); Bill Emerson, Cliff Waldron & The Lee Highway Boys (Red Fox Inn); Bob Goff & The Bluegrass Buddies (Plaza 7 Restaurant); Jim & Dean & The Bluegrass Valley Boys (Moose Lodge); Page Valley Boys (300 Club; Starlight Room); Francis Tinsman & The Potomac Valley Boys (Sterling Ruritan Club). These events were listed in Bluegrass Unlimited and Washington Star.
