The Folklore Society of Greater Washington is delighted to present the 25th Washington Folk Festival on Saturday, June 4 from noon to 10 pm and Sunday, June 5 from noon to 6 pm, RAIN OR SHINE, at historic Glen Echo Park.

For over 24 years, this festival has been a gift of music, dance, storytelling, and crafts from artists living throughout the Washington, DC area. This year's 25th Anniversary celebration commemorates the heritage of the past and welcomes the new, presenting a rich assortment of music, song and dance from the DC area's diverse cultures that represent countries from around the world as well as a rainbow of traditional American music styles. Over two full days, the festival presents continuous performances and workshops for every interest and every age, on seven stages – all for *FREE*.

At any hour during the Festival, you can hear stories woven by the area's best storytellers, attend the performances

of hundreds of your neighbors from richly varied cultures and countries, sing the blues along with Archie's Barbershop, join dance sessions and workshops, and shop with over 26 local crafters presenting their wares and demonstrating their techniques. The Washington Folk Festival is an all-volunteer event. All performers, staff, and support personnel donate their time, talent, and services. We wish to thank them for working so hard through the year and during the festival to bring this festival to life. We also give special thanks to the Glen Echo Park Partnership for Arts and Culture,

the National Park Service, Montgomery County and our media sponsor, WAMU 88.5 FM, for their continued support and generosity. Without them, this festival would not be possible.


"The perfect balance between tradition and innovation" Saturday, June 11 • 8 pm

Over the past decade, the three superb musicians who make up **Nightingale** — Becky Tracy (fiddle), **Jeremiah McLane** (piano, accordion), and **Keith Murphy** (guitar, mandolin, foot percussion, vocals) have charmed audiences with their vibrant and imaginative explorations of musical traditions that carry listeners across New England to Quebec, Newfoundland, Ireland, France, and be yond.

Hailed in *Sing Out!* Magazine for their "impeccable playing . . . danceable and exciting, with a reflective approach to the music," *Nightingale* has fashioned a fresh and distinctive sound that is innovative while rooted in Celtic and Northern European folk traditions. From a Newfoundland ballad to a blazing set of Irish reels, from a rollicking Quebecois *chanson-a-repondre* to a lilting *bourree* from Central France, their song and tune arrangements find the perfect balance between tradition and innovation. *Nightingale* is well-known as one of the best, most sought-after contradance bands ever to come out of Vermont, and they will be playing for the FSGW Sunday night dance the very next night. But their music goes well beyond mere danceability—their innovative arrangements of traditional songs and their invocation of traditional elements into their contemporary material demand the opportunity to be heard in a concert setting. Dance the night away at a contra dance, but come sit down on Saturday evening and be amazed at the depth and intricacy of their music.

Sara Grey and Kieron Means

"Both sides of the pond, times two"

Monday, June 20 • 8 pm
Dennis and Judy Cook invite you to their home in Laurel, MD, to hear music from "both sides of the pond," performed by a mother and son who both pond-skip with alacrity. Sara Grey is a familiar face in these parts—a singer of American and English folk songs. With her perky voice and her insis-

tent clawhammer banjo (usually accompanied by her distinctive foot-stomping), she's often graced us with her vast repertoire of songs from the United States and Britain. Born in New Hampshire, she's lived all over the US, scooping up local styles and delving into whatever performers and printed resources she could find, finding old traditional songs and ballads—especially wonderful versions of ballads we haven't heard yet. She's lived in Wales and England, too, and currently calls Scotland her home; she picks up British stuff as avidly as the American.

This time, she brings along her son, Kieron Means, making his FSGW debut. Born in the U.S. and brought up largely in Britain, **Kieron** learned from his folks. He takes after his mother in his love for traditional song, and supplements it with a love of contemporary songs. His youthful sensibility has developed with elements from both sides of the pond, in his choice of styles and repertoire. His guitar is understated, and his voice can be high and lonesome or rich and mellow, depending on the needs of the song.


Washington Ethical Society (WES)

Auditorium. 7750 16th St., NW, just south of the intersection of Kalmia Rd. and 16th St., about four blocks inside the DC/MD line.

From the Beltway: Take the Georgia Avenue South exit. Stay in either right lane. Go 0.4 miles from the exit ramp, where the right lanes curve and put you on 16th St South. Follow 16th past East-West Hwy (Rte 410); cross the MD/DC line at Portal Dr. Kalmia Road is the first traffic signal south of the line, and WES is the second building on the right after you cross Kalmia. You may park on Kalmia Road by turning right at the light, or on either side of 16th St.

By Metro: Red Line to Silver Spring. Exit and walk southwest on Colesville Road two blocks to the traffic circle; cross 16th Street, then walk south 4 blocks on 16th Street to the Washington Ethical Society, 7750 16th St., the second building on the right after Kalmia Road, NW. If you'd rather not walk, an S-4 Metrobus will deliver you to the corner of Kalmia Rd. and 16th St.

The Bumper Car Pavilion is located just past and to the right of the carousel. From the Beltway:
MARYLAND SIDE: at 2-lane Exit 40 take the left fork for Cabin John Parkway. Where Cabin John merges with Clara Barton

Pkwy, move into the left lane, under the overhang.

VIRGINIA SIDE: get into the far right hand lane at the top of the bridge. At the first fork, bear right. Stay in the left lane; watch for Cabin John traffic merging from the right at the overhang.

MD/VA: Watch for signs to MacArthur Blvd. Make a very sharp hairpin turn and move immediately into the right lane. At the T intersection/stop sign, turn left onto MacArthur Blvd. Upper parking lot on the left. For lower parking lot, go around the small traffic circle and make the first left onto Oxford St.

By public transportation: Take the #29 bus from the Friendship Heights Metro Station. Ask the driver to let you know when to get off for Glen Echo Park. The bus stops running before the dance ends. Ask the dance coordinator to announce you need a ride. We've never left anybody at the park. Last bus leaves Friendship Heights Metro at 7:30 pm. Glen Echo Town Hall 6106 Harvard St., Glen Echo, MD: From the Beltway:

MARYLAND SIDE: at 2-lane Exit 40 take the left fork for Cabin John Parkway. Where Cabin John merges with Clara Barton Pkwy, move into the left lane, under the overhang. VIRGINIA SIDE: get into the far right hand lane at the top of the bridge. At the first fork, bear right. Stay in the left lane; watch for Cabin John traffic merging from the right at the overhang.
