26th Annual Washington Folk Festival Glen Echo Park, MD • FREE! Saturday, June 3 • Sunday, June 4 12 to 11 pm 12 to 6 pm.

This is the 26th year of the Washington Folk Festival, featuring D.C. area musicians, dancers, storytellers, and crafts! The annual event at the famous Glen Echo Park in Glen Echo, MD, is a great weekend for folks of all ages.

Performances take place simultaneously on six stages and in Glen Echo Park's historic and newly-renovated Spanish Ballroom. The Festival goes on rain-or-shine; performance areas are covered. Food is available at a café in the Ballroom building, and the grounds include a picnic area under trees.

One hundred thirty-seven performances are scheduled over the two days of the Festival. Acts include: bagpipes, singer-songwriters, Joe Hickerson, Joe Glazer, Bruce Hutton, Slaveya, Lisa Moscatiello, Bill Mayhew and a host of other storytellers, Randy Barrett, Arte Flamenco, JP McDermott, Reverb, Iona, Sue Trainor, Bill Jenkins, Magpie, Jennifer Cutting's Ocean Orchestra, Dead Men's Hollow, Iain Campbell Smith, Hoag, Kelley & Pilzer, Al Raposo and the World Jam Club, Dulcie Taylor, Blues Works, Blue Rhythm Boys, dance workshops in: Italian, Cajun, Hot Jazz, Romanian, Belly Dance, Bulgarian, Puerto Rican, Irish Set Dancing, Scandinavian, and English Country Dancing. The Festival is an all-volunteer event, presenting more than 500 folk musicians, dancers, and crafts from throughout the Washington, DC area. Performers are drawn from all ethnic groups and musical persuasions. There will be lots of blues, bluegrass, Celtic, Eastern-European, and country music. Singer-songwriters will have mini-concerts throughout the festival as well as a showcase Saturday night. You can get free instruction to try dancing to Cajun, Puerto Rican, or Celtic music. Learn to contra dance Saturday night. If you get tired, there will be music on every stage until 10 pm. International music will include Persian hammer dulcimer and drums, Jamaican reggae, Spanish flamenco, Korean drums, Balkan harmonies, Japanese zithers, and Armenian dancers. You and your family will be sure to find something you like!





DRIVING & MASS TRANSIT DIRECTIONS TO FREQUENT VENUES:

Washington Ethical Society (WES)

Auditorium. 7750 16th St., NW, just south of the intersection of Kalmia Rd. and 16th St., about four blocks inside the DC/MD line.

FROM THE BELTWAY:


Take the Georgia Avenue South exit. Stay in either right lane. Go 0.4 miles from the exit ramp, where the right lanes curve and put you on 16th St South. Follow 16th past East-West Hwy (Rte 410); cross the MD/DC line at Portal Dr. Kalmia Road is the first traffic signal south of the line, and WES is the second building on the right after you cross Kalmia. You may park on Kalmia Road by turning right at the light, or on either side of 16th St.

By Metro: Red Line to Silver Spring. Exit and walk southwest on Colesville Road two blocks to the traffic circle; cross 16th Street, then walk south 4 blocks on 16th Street to the Washington Ethical Society, 7750 16th St., the second building on the right after Kalmia Road, NW. If you'd rather not walk, an S-4 Metrobus will deliver you to the corner of Kalmia Rd. and 16th St.

The Bumper Car Pavilion is located just past and to the right of the carousel. **FROM THE BELTWAY:**


