Most people throw holiday parties <u>before</u> the holiday in question. We're throwing ours <u>after</u> Chanukah, <u>after</u> Christmas and <u>before</u> New Year's Eve! The family gatherings are winding down and shopping is done, so join us for a relaxing, harmonious, entertaining, family-friendly, participatory afternoon of music with some of our talented area performers.

The fine a cappella harmonies of **Reverb** kick things off. Washington Folk Festival favorites, they include gospel from the African-American quartet tradition rooted in the 19th century and popularized in the 1930s and '40s along with doo-wop that developed in urban centers in the '50s and '60s. Expect tradition, inspiration and R&B. Since 1991, **Reverb** has performed along the East Coast, toured in Africa, the Caribbean and the Persian Gulf, and graced DC's own Cherry Blossom Festival. They've also received Washington Area Music Awards (Wammies) for Best Harmony Group and Best Gospel Group.

After our first intermission, we'll be entertained by the Wammiewinning ensemble *Hesperus*. **Tina Chancey** co-founded the group in 1979 to celebrate centuries-old chamber-music tradi-



tions. Since then, they've toured the world and collaborated to include world music, American Colonial music, Appalachian traditions and in recent years, provide live







November 2014 Board meeting highlights

- The Treasurer will follow up on independent audit progress. FSGW cannot request grants until an independent audit has been completed. Funding for the audit was previously approved.
- The Board congratulated the Treasurer and Vice President for their successful efforts to reduce FiftyFest losses (original estimated loss was \$12,000).
- Charlie Baum reported on this year's FSGW Getaway and Janie Meneely reported on the second annual Capital Maritime Music Festival.
- The Board approved partial funding for Youth Traditional Song travel costs.
- Planning for Mini-Fest 2015 is underway.
- The Board discussed the failure of House of Printing to set up email forwarding after the retirement of FSGW's long-time contact there. HP's failure to do so meant that the print-ready FSGW November Newsletter sat in an unread email account until the end of October, and publication and mailing were late.

SLOW AS MOLASSES IN NOVEMBER

Getting the Newsletter to your mailboxes on time is a fairly complex process, and there are several "hand-offs" along the way. Last month, one such hand-off became a fumble.

For at least a decade, the final ready-to-print version of the FSGW Newsletter has been forwarded electronically to an employee of FSGW's long-time print house. In early October, that employee retired. And apparently the print house neglected to either (a) set up an email forwarding system or (b) assign anyone to check that employee's email at least once a week. So the beautifully laid out November issue simply sat in hyperspace for almost two weeks. We did not discover that the print house had failed to retrieve and print it (and send it to the mailing house) until the first of November. It took a few days to process and print, and a few more to get it over to the mailing house, and a few more still to get it to the post office for delivery.

We don't anticipate this problem arising ever again -- we have a new contact at the print house -- but please accept FSGW's apology for the delay.



Database Cleanup and How to Vote Electronically

Are you an FSGW Member? We need your help. The Board of Directors will be doing a "database scrub" over the next few weeks, to ensure that the information in the Member Directory is correct, prior to the next election.

Please go to the website and log in. Never logged in before? Click on the right-hand button near the top of the webpage – the one marked FSGW Log In. Enter your last name (capitalized) in the left-hand box, and your Member ID in the right – hand box. Your Member ID is printed on the back of your paper copy of the Newsletter, and it should also be on your Membership card. Can't find either? Email me (president@fsgw.org) and I'll look it up for you.

Once you're on the Members Page, click on the left-hand button, marked Directory. Type in your first or last name, or your address, or your ID number, and click on the button at the bottom, marked Click to Find. That should take you to your entry. Is the information correct?

If anything is incorrect, please make a note of what needs to be changed. Even if nothing needs to be changed, please keep reading, and take the next step – choose electronic voting.

Now click on the button My Profile (Next to the LOGOUT button). This should take you to a window that shows your name at the top. THIS is where you can select electronic voting, or electronic newsletter delivery. Please consider checkmarking Ballots (paper ballots are very expensive), and if you no longer want a paper copy of the Newsletter, please also check the Newsletter box. Once you have made corrections, be sure to click on the Click to Save Changes box. At the bottom is a series of small buttons where you can change other entries (address, etc.) and change what information is visible to Members.

The Directory is only available to FSGW Members, but you may mark any of your entries "Private" if you wish.

Finally, if you'd like to change your password, so you don't have to find your Member ID, just click on the Password button at the bottom, and enter whatever you'd like the new password to be.


