If it's a single concert: Concert Individual [Month] And so forth. Putting the category in the subject line makes it easier for the editor to retrieve groups of events.
- 2. Please submit all listings in FSGW format. All information should be submitted in the following sequence:

Event Title • City, State Abbreviation

Day of the week, Date • start time - end time

One or two sentences only. Location (+ zip code for GPS). Ticket prices.

Info: Contact Name at Phone number or email/website.

NB: The city and state appear in the header; do not repeat them in the body, but in this age of Droids and GPS units, you need to include the 5-digit zip code – it goes right after the street address.

Storytelling! Meeting new folkie friends! Seeing old friends from far and near! Admiring the great waterfront view! All this and more is waiting for you at the 51st annual FSGW Getaway, October 2-4, at West River Conference Center on a beautiful inlet of the Chesapeake Bay. If you can't make it for the whole weekend, come for the day! Register now!

We have a great lineup of special guests this year: Cindy Kallet and Grey Larsen will bring their remarkable voices and many instruments; The Short Sisters (Kim Wallach, Grey Larsen and Cindy Kallet

Fay Baird, and Kate Seeger) will come together from their diverse home towns with their special brand of songs old and new; Sheila Kay Adams and the Scofflaws (Branson Raines and Dan

**Lewis**) come from Western North Carolina with their authentic string band sound, stories, and more; and **Tim Radford** will be here with lots of ballads and rousing maritime songs. All of these folks will be performing in mini-concerts and participating in lots of work-

shops. Unfortunately, Jill Rogoff has had to cancel her US tour and so will not be with us after all — we hope to see her in the future!

We're hoping to encourage more folks to bring their kids — or grandkids — and want to plan appropriate activities for them, so do let us know in advance how many children you'll be bringing, and their ages.

The weekend starts off on Friday evening with a pot-luck supper and a big sing-around. Saturday and Sunday we have a full program of informal participatory workshops, mini-concerts, song circles, and jam sessions, with 3 or 4 (and sometimes 5) events occurring simultaneously, so there's

always plenty to choose from. On those evenings we have sign-up concerts – a chance to show us all what you can do – and lots of spontaneous song swaps and jam sessions, until whenever. There are CDs and instruments and crafts for sale, and a silent auction to benefit our scholarship fund - bring an item to donate and take a different one home!

**ACCOMMODATIONS:** There are 50 bedrooms in buildings with heat, AC, and hot showers, with up to four bunks per room (a discount is offered if you'll volunteer to take an upper bunk; if you cannot get yourself into an upper bunk, please let us know). Tents and RVs are OK, but no hookups are available. Public gathering areas and some bedrooms are handicapped accessible. Special dietary needs may be accommodated if you let us know in advance. Limited kitchen facilities (fridge, freezer, microwave) are available to us at all times. No smoking is permitted indoors, and we are asked not to bring any alcohol.

### **New FSGW Co-sponsored Song Circle in Silver Spring**

There were lots of smiles and laughter and even a few tears of nostalgia at the inaugural session of the Schweinhaut Song Circle on Wednesday, July 29. Co-sponsored by FSGW, Carpe Diem Arts and the Margaret Schweinhaut Senior Center, the Circle attracted 55 participants to its first session.

Founded and led by long-time FSGW member **Fred Stollnitz**, the Circle is designed to bring the joy of informal group singing to people who no longer drive at night.

At the first session, magical things happened. People who had never sung together blended their voices in beautiful harmonies. Gifted professional pianist **Brenda Stephens** came to



the Schweinhaut Center to grab a quick lunch, heard the music, went to investigate and ended up staying for a full hour. She provided tasteful accompaniments that kept singers on track without stepping on their musical toes. FSGW members **Kathie Mack, Liz Milner, Dottie Hurley, Jennifer Woods** and **Bob Clayton** helped lead songs. **Busy Graham** of Carpe Diem Arts, and **Greg Lewis** of Washington Revels, successfully guided 55 people through a round. The group sang familiar songs, such as "This Little Light of Mine," "The City of New Orleans" and "Ramblin' Boy," and songs that were new to most of the participants, such as "Do You Love an Apple" and "The Parting Glass." Dottie, Liz, and Bob added welcome accompaniment on ukulele and guitars.



The next Schweinhaut Song Circle will be held on Wednesday, September 16 at 1 p.m. People of all ages and abilities are welcome to attend.

"The Schweinhaut Center's director, **Amanda DeFilippo**, has enthusiastically supported the Song Circle from the moment I first told her the idea," Fred says. "I'm grateful to her, to Liz Milner, Janie Meneely, and FSGW officers, and to Busy Graham, for all of the support and encouragement they've provided. The contributions of song leaders, accompanists, and several others, especially Janet Stollnitz, who helped to prepare for and conduct the first session, have been crucial to its success."

The song circle is part of FSGW's outreach program. Former Board member Liz Milner had seen the heavy toll boredom took on friends and relatives in retirement communities and nursing homes, and she enlisted the Board in an ongoing project to bring FSGW programming to members who could no longer come to us. An intergenerational song circle and a fall concert are in the works. Liz hopes that Fred's song circle will inspire a host of imitations.

Max Godfrey and Elias Alexander are the New Millennium Jelly Rollers. They play Southern American music with rare soul, striking a dynamic balance between rootedness and spontaneity. Their performance will include mountain ballads, fiddle tunes, work songs and country blues on fiddle, guitar, banjo, harmonica, and cajon. Many of these songs are participatory, so come ready to cut loose, sing out, and have a great time!

Max Godfrey comes from Georgia, and has a voice that sounds like a Lomax field recording. No wonder that he delved into traditional music whole hog, and learned a large repertoire ranging from old-time fiddle to prison blues. He'll play dance music when the situation calls for it, but he's also committed to bringing the traditional rhythm-setting work songs to present-day cooperative organic farmers for application to modern work.

Elias Alexander is originally from Oregon, and is slowly becoming a New England regular by way of college in Vermont and a new home base in Boston. A writer and actor as well as a multi-instrumentalist musician, Elias plays everything from Afro-Celtic to brass band music. Although he probably won't show off for us, he has been known to play bagpipes while riding a unicycle.

Did we mention that each of these talented performers is a still-young twenty-something?



**WHAT TO BRING:** Along with voices, instruments, and your love of music, bring bedding, pillows, towels & soap, flashlight, and a coffee mug to help save paper. No pets, please.

**RATES AND REGISTRATION:** See registration form on page 19 and explanation below. Rates are for one, two, or three nights, and for day-trippers who bring their own food. To dine at the Getaway buffet, you MUST register in advance. If you register for two nights, the fee covers three meals and a late-night snack both Saturday and Sunday. A three-night registration gives you an additional night's lodging and breakfast on Monday morning. A one-night registration gives you all meals and snacks on either Saturday or Sunday, and, if you wish, a bed on either adjacent night.

**Payment notes:** We have been able to keep our prices as low as possible this year, but recognize that some folks may still have a problem with the cost. 
