# Magpie Seasons of Light Friday, December 18 \* 8 pm

From Solstice to Chanukah to Christmas to Kwanzaa, many cultures celebrate the turn of the winter season in the Northern Hemisphere, watchful of the sun's incremental return and imbuing the longer days with gratitude for times past and optimism for the year to come. The changing season resonates with hope and freedom, of new life and new beginnings and of the basic principles for living together in peace and prosperity. **Greg Artzner** and **Terry Leonino** (aka *Magpie*) perform music and tell stories from traditions that mark this "Season of Light," celebrating the many common themes of these cultural festivals: the changing seasons, respect for nature, the quest for freedom, kindness to others, unity, cooperation, purpose and creativity.

Long active in the DC metropolitan area, *Magpie* is the contemporary folk duo of **Greg Artzner** and **Terry Leonino**. Known as environmental musicians, activists and teachers, they have spent over 40 years performing all over the country (heck, all over the world) in festivals, schools, historical associations and museums, including the Smithsonian. They are also Master Artists with the Wolf Trap Institute for Early Learning Through the Arts. Originally from Ohio and long-time residents of Takoma Park, they now make their home in upstate New York.

If you haven't heard them—and local opportunities to give a listen abound, from the annual Washington Folk Festival in June to countless area performances—imagine two strong voices that can take the lead as easily as they can blend in magical two-part harmonies. Greg's guitar arrangements and masterful playing accompany

NB: The city and state appear in the header; do not repeat them in the body, but in this age of Droids and GPS units, you need to include the 5-digit zip code – it goes right after the street address.



# Passings to Note:

In the last couple of months we've lost important members of our greater folk community:



**Leon Bibb**, 2/7/22-10/23/15, stunning baritone, 60s folk icon, noted Broadway actor, civil rights activist, and father of current singer Eric Bibb.

Sonya Cohen Cramer, 1965 - 10/9/1, daughter of John Cohen (of New Lost City Ramblers) and the late Penny Seeger (sister of Pete), Smithsonian Folkways graphic artist and member of Last Forever with Dick Connette, presenting whole new approaches to traditional American songs. She lived in Takoma Park, MD.





Jerry Epstein, (1941-2015), a founder of the Folk Music Society of New York in 1965 and frequent participant in FSGW events, died of congestive heart failure on September 23. A performer and teacher, he was also one of the movers and shakers of the traditional folk community for the last 50 years. Besides organizing many of FMSNY's events and serving on its Board of Directors, Jerry went on to be the musical director of Revels New York, the director of CDSS's Folk Music Week, and was instrumental in the revival of the Eisteddfod in New York.

**John Jennings,** 1953-10/17/15

Local songwriter, musician, producer and real gentleman, he brought the talent of Mary Chapin Carpenter to the world; produced and frequently played an assortment of backup instruments and vocals for Janis Ian, John Gorka, Robin & Linda Williams, Bill Morrissey, and Beausoleil, among others. The quintessential backup studio musician also released several solo albums.





Bill Keith, 12/20/39-10/23/15, banjo player, inventor of Keith tuner and Keith-style picking, member of *Bill Monroe's Bluegrass Boys* and of the *Jim Kweskin Jug Band*, he performed solo, and recorded with **Judy Collins, Richie Havens**, the Bee Gees and many others.

**Chuck Pyle**, 1/28/45-11/6/15, noted singer & songwriter. touring singer and guitarist, Colorado's "Zen Cowboy" wrote memorable



songs for Chris LeDoux, Jerry Jeff Walker, John Denver, Nitty Gritty Dirt Band, and Suzy Bogguss among others, inspired by his surroundings in the Centennial State.



**AllenToussaint** 1/14/38-11/11/15, "who spent his life drawing upon the music traditions of Louisiana, while composing such R&B classics as *Working in the Coal Mine, Mother-in-Law, Southern Nights* and *Yes We Can Can*. He was producer and mentor to scores of musicians. He died while on a tour in Madrid.
