Maelstrom with Two Sisters

Saturday, November 19 · 8-10 pm

Maelstrom is a high-energy trio of local teen music prodigies, **Abraham Joyner-Meyers** (fiddle, guitar, voice), **Peri Leighty** (fiddle, voice), and **Darrow Sherman** (fiddle, banjo, voice). In their first year performing together, they pleased crowds at the triple crown—the Washington Folk Festival, FSGW Midwinter Festival, and Takoma Park Folk Festival. In their own words: "We began playing together while studying fiddle traditions in Ireland. Although our roots are in Celtic music, we are inspired by the huge variety of folk traditions and are excited by playful fusions. We play everything from French Canadian tunes to Klezmer. Our sound is recognized for its tight and creative harmonies."

The *Two Sisters* (Guen & Liz Spilsbury) are classically trained singers who grew up in the Washington Revels children's and teen choruses, with annual studies at Pinewoods folk music and dance camp in Massachusetts and appearances with the Victorian Lyric Opera Company. They are also both second-generation folk dancers (daughters of popular caller, **Tom Spilsbury**). While the *Two Sisters* are no strangers to the stage, this is their concert debut as a



FAQ of the Month

Q: Why do we have so many concerts at this venue? Why aren't there more concerts at that venue?

A: The biggest factors by far are cost and availability. Hall rental can be very expensive and we don't want to drive ticket prices higher with avoidable costs, so we try to use the most cost-effective venue that can hold the expected audience. Many venues have standing bookings on certain days of the week, so our options are sometimes limited. In addition, we try to use venues that are close to a Metro station or at least a bus stop with reliable service. Finally, some venues are good for acoustic performances and others require a sound system, so it depends in part on who's performing — Mike Livingston, Program Chair

- 2. Please submit all listings in FSGW format. All information should be submitted in the following sequence:

Day of the week, Date • start time - end time

One or two sentences only. Location (+ zip code for GPS). Ticket prices.


