## Jake Blount Award-Winning Fiddler

## Friday, January 31 · 8 pm

Jake Blount is an award-winning fiddler, banjoist, singer, and scholar whose performances, compositions, and research venerate and reflect the traditional music of African-American and Indigenous communities in the southeastern US. He is half of the internationally tour-

ing duo *Tui* and a 2020 Strathmore Artist in Residence. In 2016, Blount

became the first Black person to make the finals at the prestigious Appalachian String Band Music Festival in Clifftop, West Virginia, and the first to win in the traditional band category. In the following year, he received a bachelor of arts in ethnomusicology from Hamilton College and released his debut EP, *Reparations*, with award-winning fiddler **Tatiana Hargreaves**. He has shared his music and research at the Smithsonian Institution, the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston, Massachusetts, and other museums, colleges, and universities. Blount's live performances are truly inspiring and wholly mesmerizing. "Fiddlin' Claude" Martin (1987-2016) was one of the finest fiddle players of his generation, and he embodied everything the Folklore Society of Greater Washington has worked since 1964 to promote: a link between old traditions and new generations, not only using his talent to present vibrant interpretations of timeless music, but understanding the role of the music as that golden thread that weaves our community.

In his memory, the Folklore Society of Greater Washington awards an honorary life membership in FSGW to an accomplished yet rising traditional artist under 30. We are pleased to announce that this year's recipient is **Jake Blount**. A resident of Washington, DC, **Jake** embodies the artistry, scholarship, and contribution to community of Martin's legacy that this award honors.

Rachel Eddy hails from West Virginia, where she grew up steeped in Appalachian music and dance. Known throughout the world for her dynamic, emotionally powerful performances and virtuosic playing on the fiddle and banjo, she is now based in Alexandria VA, and brings her multi-instrumental talent and soulful singing to the Alexandria After Work stage in a rare local performance. She's performed alongside the likes of Tim O'Brien, Bruce Molsky, and Uncle Earl, invigorated the Swedish old-time scene after a years-long residence in Stockholm, and currently tours with *The Early Mays* (Pittsburgh) and *The Kolodner Quartet* (Baltimore). Don't miss this special concert from one of old-time's most respected and electrifying musicians!

- In the Cafetorium, six hours of concerts programmed by **Charlie Baum**, including a concert of Balkan a capella music by Slaveya, instrumental Balkan music by the Ha Sega! duo; honky-tonk country music by Karen Collins and the Backroads Band; Irish music and dance by The Bog Band; music of the sea and other bodies of water by Washington Revels Maritime Voices; and the afternoon concludes with Roma-influenced jazz from Djangolaya and the New Orleans-style roots music of the *Capitol Hillbillies*.
- The Storytelling Program is again organized by **Tim Livengood**. This year's program will honor the memory of **Bob** Rovinsky with stories from one generation to another. Tellers include: Barbara Effron, Jane Dorfman, Noa Baum, Laura J. Bobrow, Miriam Nadel, Tim Livengood, and the Twinbrook Tellers – the next generation of storytellers.
- The Jams Room, programmed by Charlie Baum and April Blum, should include a Gospel Sing, Shape Note Singing, a Doo-Wop Sing, a blues jam featuring musicians from Archie's Barbershop and, new this year, Suffrage Movement songs led by Steve Woodbury.
- The Traditional Song Room, programmed by Lisa Null, will feature singers Don Stallone, Skip Casale, Melissa Weaver Dunning, Kevin Elam, Martha Burns, Dan Kaufman, Eleanor Ellis, Steve Winick, Bea Leman, Pete Kraemer, Connie McKenna and The Spilsbury Sisters (ballad singers Guen and Liz Spilsbury.
- The American Roots track, hosted by Jan Scopel and Kim Forry, will feature The Zsebenyi Family and Appalachian fiddle music; Tony and Marge Sume, old-time porch groove music with fiddle and guitar; The Fiddlin' Willie Band for toe-tapping Americana, and an old time Jam led by Sandy Hoferth of Backstep Cindy from 5-6.
- The Family Room, programmed by Ingrid Gorman, will feature participatory song and dance for families. There's Carpe Diem Arts Ukestra; a family dance led by Kappy Laning; an hour of open mic audience participation, and music by Bill Jenkins; King Bullfrog; and The All New Genetically Altered Jug Band.
- The Spare Room will include a small pipes workshop led by **Dan Gillespie**; an Appalachian dulcimer workshop, led by Carl and Kathleen Gotzmer; and a chantey sing, hosted by Brad Graham.
- The Main Gym will feature six hours of participatory dance, beginning at noon with Scottish Country Dance, followed by Flamenco, Tango, English Country Dance, Scandinavian Dance, and French balfolk. The Auxiliary Gym features waltz, couples dancing, contra, a barn dance for all, and a repeat of last year's very popular rappersword workshop, led by members of Sligo Creek Sword.
- From 7:30 to 10:30, two simultaneous evening programs in the Main Gym, an engaging evening of English Country Dance with local musicians and callers; and in the Cafetorium, a concert of music and stories, programmed by Charlie **Baum** and inspired by the works of the storyteller **Bob Rovinsky**.






