The Grapevine is spoken word performance for adults and teens, celebrating the timeless art of the story, hosted by storytellers **Noa Baum, Renée Brachfeld**, and **Tim Livengood**. You only need one ticket per device that you connect - but you may donate as much as you like! Grapevine tellers are paid by your *donations*! Suggested \$15 donation per person.

Hawaiian-Japanese-Korean storyteller **Alton Takiyama-Chung** grew up with the superstitions and the magic of the Hawaiian Islands. He tells stories of Hawaii, of the Japanese-American experience of WWII, and Asian folktales, and has performed at Timpanogos and the National Storytelling Festival, and at storytelling festivals in the Cayman Islands, Singapore, India, Vietnam, and Thailand.

Janice Del Negro excavates and decorates the bones of folk and fairy tales, reimagining traditional tales to make them emotionally resonant for contemporary listeners. Her latest recording is Fortune's Daughters: Ghost Tales and Folktales. In 2016, Del Negro received the National Storytelling Network's Circle of Excellence Award.

- All copy must be submitted by e-mail to newsletter@fsgw.org in text format in the body of the e-mail by the 8th of the preceding month.
- All listings must be submitted in the format set out in the "How to Submit" Box above. The format is also on our website (fsgw.org). Just click on Newsletter and look for a paragraph in green. • The Editor reserves the right to edit or omit copy as necessary. Ad content must be approved by the Editor.

Basic Ad charges: 1/4 page ads (3.4" x 4.5" or 7.25" x 2.5"): \$65 for one month, \$120 for two. Commercial business: \$8 for 10 words. Noncommercial and individual: 54 for 10 words. 25% discount for any single ad placed in 11 consecutive issues (one year) and paid in advance. We will work with you on larger ads.
