



It has become one of the largest and

most active groups in the country supporting the traditional arts.

FSGW events are open to the public and include concerts large and small (most featuring performers from outside the area), regular weekly and monthly dances, programs for children, workshops, day-long master classes, song swaps, story swaps, festivals, periodic gatherings on special themes such as shape-note singing,

and a host of other activities. Yet most FSGW members are not performers; they are simply people who love participating in traditional arts. They look to FSGW to inform them about folk events and to make more events happen. Look around at this Festival, and at all the people who enjoy what FSGW does. If you'd like to join, it's easy (just send in the form) and inexpensive—\$33 a year for individuals and \$45 for families. We hope to see you at future FSGW events!






