
Pierce Hall, 15th and Harvard Sts. NW., Washington, has been reserved for use of the Folklore Society of Greater Washington, the evenings of October 8, November 12 and December 10, 1965, and tentatively reserved for the Society the evenings of January 14, February 11, March 11, April 8, May 13 and June 10, 1966.

~~There is a lighted parking lot for about 100 cars one block south of the hall and just east of 15th street.~~ Official closing time is 11 p.m., but it is not too strictly enforced, according to Jack Sorinen (DE 2-5266), who is responsible for renting the hall. There is a modern projector, screen, p.a. system. Total capacity is 350. Fee per evening is \$35, made out to ~~the~~ All Souls Unitarian Church, and payable by check thru the mail after each use of the hall.

A lighted parking lot for about 100/^{cars} is one block south of the hall and just east of 15th street.

Concerning the first program, October 8, Mr. Sorinen suggested that the Society's projectionist visit the hall before the day of the program and he would introduce him to the workings of the projector, which, according to him, are somewhat complicated.
