Dear Members and Friends:

I am writing primarily about the Folklore Society's camping weekend, which is taking place Sept. 30 - Oct. 2 at Prince William Forest Park as scheduled. However, before we get into that I want to remind everyone that there is only one more "backyard picnic" event scheduled for the summer, and that It will be held at John and Cora Jackson's, 6537 Ox Road (Rt. 123), Fairfax Station, Va. The newsletter announced that it would be held August 27th, but the Jackson's have requested that it be changed to Sunday, September 4th, so adjust your calendar accordingly and for further information and directions, give them a call at 278-8325.

As far the "Folk Getaway", here are the latest developments. The cost for the weekend (including lodging and food for all except Friday night) will be \$7.50 per adult, and \$4.00 per child. Since a family membership in the Society includes the adult members of the family and all children under 16, we accordingly shall charge all children over 16 the adult fee. Likewise any babe in arms or child sufficiently small as to not require bed and board furnished by the Society shall be admitted free.

At this time there are approximately 40 reservations still available. A number of people have expressed an interest but have not requested a definite reservation, so I expect the vacancies will be filled rapidly when it's known how few there are remaining. We will take reservations until Sept. 12th, and should we reach camp capacity before that date all additional names will go on a waiting list to be notified of any cancellations on a first come - first served basis. All fees should be paid to the Society c/o Nan Perdue, 9936 Braddock Rd., Fairfax, Va. 22030, by Sept. 12th also. This will give us sufficient time to do all the buying involved in an operation this size. We will hold reservations open for those who signed up in advance until Sept. 12, whereupon if we have not received a check or notification that they are still intending to participate, we shall fill those vacancies with names from the waiting list. If you have sent your reservation and check by Sept. 12 and it results that space is not available, your check will be returned promptly.

As soon as all reservations are secured, I will assign a cabin number to everyone, (families will each have a cabin to themselves to the extent that this is possible, however, if there are teen-age sons or daughters who would prefer to be in dormitories with other boys and girls their age, inform me of this when you send your check...once space is assigned, that's it!) send out maps showing the location of the cabins, and tags for each person, which must be worn for the duration of the weekend. Only persons with proper tags will permitted past the gate to the camp area, and this will be strictly enforced.

I commented before that the cost includes everything except food for Friday night, and I am asking that everyone eat before they arrive Friday or else bring their meal already prepared. People will be arriving at all hours that evening making it difficult to organize a large meal, also two events are scheduled in the dining hall for the evening. They are an informal concert from 8-10 P.M., and a coffee hour (for adults only) from 10:30 - 11:30 P.M. However, to relieve us of the cooking chore for the remainder of the weekend, we have hired three women from Nokesville, Va. to take over the kitchen and turn out the meals. So we are still getting off pretty easy I think...

Other miscellaneous items: Anyone who has a Red Cross Lifesaving Badge, and would be willing to spend allittle time on duty at the lake, please contact Gerry Parsons, 737-0118. Also if there is anyone in the group who has a well stocked first aid kit, and who would be willing to let the Society use it with the understanding that all expended items would be replaced, please call me at 273-0762. If anyone knows where we can borrow or ment cheaply institution type cooking ware and silverware, let me hear from you. Any and all offers of help will be appreciated greatly by myself and the Society.
