The increasing cost of publishing the Newsletter was discussed. There was a consensus that the Newsletter needs wide circulation because it lends prestige and advertises the activities of the Society. People who wish to be placed on the mailing list will be asked to give \$1.00. There will be further discussion on how to extract the dollar from people at the meeting of the Newsletter (June 20th)

Program costs will be about \$60.00 over budget because of Grant Rogers Program and our guarantee to him (see Program Report, above)

Roni Bowie read a report from the Ad Hoc Committee on Establishment of a Coffee House. A copy of this report, along with a draft copy of the Constitution and By-Laws, is attached to these minutes. There is also attached a list of participants in the discussions held on the Coffee House.

After the reading of the report, questions were raised on how both organizations are going to schedule activities so as not to conflict with each other, and especially, if a member of the Society is to be a member only of their Advisory Board, how will there be any effective means of timing and scheduling activities, since the Advisory Board has no voice in the operation of the coffee house except in an advisory capacity.

Some present thought the Coffee House will be a threat to the Society, and that perhaps we should discuss the aims of our Society, and the types of programs both organizations might generate.

AD HOC COMMITTEE ON ESTABLISHMENT OF A COFFEE HOUSE REPORT

DISCUSSION ON REPORT Joe Hickerson prepared a statement in reply to the Ad Hoc Committee Report:

Due to the fact that the Folk Arts Club Committee was proposed and formed through Folklore Society of Greater Washington channels and interests, and due to the regularity and frequency of the two groups' proposed activities in the same areas of concern, and due to the need of communication and coordination within these areas on the part of the two groups, we urge the Folk Arts Club Committee include a designee of the Folklore Society of Greater Washington on the Club's Board of Directors.

The statement was approved as written above.
