OLD BUSINESS:

The Budget Meeting will be held Thursday, July 19, at 8:00 p.m. in the NFFA office. All board members will be notified, and are urged to attend.

There will be no regular monthly meeting of the Board in August.

The Getaway will be held October 19-22 at Camp 4 in Prince William Forest Park. Costs for the entire weekend will be \$20 for adults and \$10 for children under 16. NEW BUSINESS:

The YMCA has asked us to co-sponsor a concert on August 19, 4:00 p.m. at the Bethesda-Chevy Chase YMCA, which would feature Russian musicians and dancers, and, hopefully, some "traditional" American music. It was decided that this could best be handled by individuals rather than by the Society.

Jill Anderson came to the meeting to ask for FSGW co-sponsorship in making a recording and TV production of a church service at Ketocin Baptist Church. Early religious music, which preceded sacred harp and other shape-note traditions, would be used in the service. After some discussion, it was decided that co-sponsorship would be of no particular benefit to anyone.

We are currently without a Publications Chairman, since Jan Hackman is getting married and will probably be leaving the Washington area. The president can appoint someone to fill this vacancy, and will do so soon.
