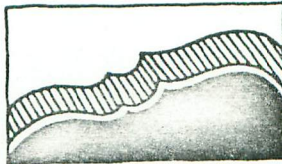

The Folklore Society of Greater Washington, a non-profit, educational organization, would like to use Gaston Hall on Friday evening, November 24, 1978, to present a concert for the benefit of Dee and Delta Hicks.

When they returned, they found that their home, with all their possessions, had burned to the ground.
