PUBLICITY - Claudia Kravets: On April 3 the Post had an article on the Open Sings. Ed Tourney did a spot on Archie Edwards Wed. evening and Thurs. noon and plugged our concert. Ed wants to do a spot for the WFF with a child in it. We will deliver the PSA videotape material to Kay Fisher at Channel 7 on Monday.
