# RICH KIRBY & TOM BLEDSOE



# GUY CARAWAN IN FSGW PROGRAM DEC. 14

Guy Carawan will be the performer for FSGW's monthly program on Friday, December 14th at 8:30 pm at the WES auditorium.

For more than 20 years Guy Carawan has been an interpreter and transmitter of folk tradition. Throughout that time he has been a source of ideas and inspiration for folk musicians and audiences alike. Guy has collected traditional lore throughout the nation and has co-authored four books and produced a dozen documentary records based on experiences in Appalachia and the South. He was also the one to introduce the hammer dulcimer to such contemporary performers as John McCutcheon and Malcolm Dalglish.

Although Guy has performed at hundreds of festivals, concerts, and colleges over the years, his performances have been limited recently due to his work at the Highlander Center in Tennessee. He has not appeared in Washington since a very successful house concert several years ago. Plan to take advantage of this rare appearance by an extraordinary musician and interpreter of traditional material.

The WES auditorium is at 7750 16th St., N.W., D.C., just below the corner of Kalmia and 16th. One half mile from the Silver Spring Metro stop on the Red Line. Admission is free for members, \$4. for non-members.
