Northern Resonance

is a Scandinavian string trio rooted in traditional folk music. They perform traditional and newly composed roots music on a previously untested combination of instruments: viola d'amore, hardanger fiddle and nyckelharpa. They combine Scandinavian music with explosive rhythms and grand chamber-like arrangements, taking folk music in a new direction.

The members of **Northern Resonance** are highly skilled and accomplished musicians, and they share an intense musical connection that is rare to come across.

Their debut album, released in 2020, introduced their glorious sound and impressed a broad audience worldwide, and was nominated for a Swedish Grammy. The trio released their second album in January 2024. northernresonance.se

Alex Cumming is a traditional Singer, Accordionist, Pianist and dance caller hailing from Somerset, England, now living in Brattleboro VT, USA. He performs songs and tunes from around the United Kingdom and America with a great depth of knowledge of the tradition. Alex has made his mark on the folk scene with his rhythmic dance-able accordion style, strong voice and his fun and engaging stage presence. After over a decade of recording albums and touring with various bands, 2024 sees Alex release his debut solo album, 'Homecoming', featuring fiddler Audrey Jaber (Wake Up Robin, Free Raisins), guitarist Max Newman (Stringrays, Nor'Easter) and regular recording collaborator Pete Ord (Haystack Records). Alex is a member of Celtic trio Bellwether (with Louise Bichan,



Eric McDonald), award winning a capella quartet *The Teacups* and critically acclaimed duo Alex Cumming & Nicola Beazley. You know **Audrey Jaber** is performing if the room is buzzing at a higher level. 2024 Washington Folk Festival Suspended

Dear FSGW Family,

It is with regret that we announce the Folklore Society of Greater Washington will not produce the Washington Folk Festival at Glen Echo Park in 2024. The Festival is beloved by many and a treasured part of the FSGW and Glen Echo Park program portfolios. The deciding factor was a shortage of resources.

This decision was not made lightly. The FSGW Board spent several months trying to establish a leadership team to organize and manage the Washington Folk Festival, but was unable to recruit individuals with the willingness, skills and time necessary to produce a festival of the quality of previous years. Additional concerns that factored into our decision were a shortage of time until the Festival as well as funding. It is for these reasons that the FSGW Board voted to suspend the Festival.

We would like to thank the many performers, volunteers, attendees,

and staff at the Glen Echo Park Partnership for Arts and Culture who have supported the Folk Festival in the past. We look forward to finding new ways to celebrate the folk arts together in the future.
