



**Elizabeth Mitchell** is a singer, songwriter, music educator, and a twice Grammy nominated Smithsonian

Folkways recording artist. Along with her husband **Daniel Littleton**, they were founding members of the band *Ida*, and continue to perform together and with their daughter Storey. Their records on Smithsonian Folkways stand consciously and directly in the tradition of children's music that Folkways has carried for nearly 60 years. In 2013, Elizabeth released *The Sounding Joy*, a collection of folk carols from Ruth Crawford Seeger's 1953 songbook *American Folk Songs for Christmas* that celebrates the spirit of community and homespun traditions, which they practice at their home in the Catskill Mountains of New York.


Grammy Award-winner **Dan Zanes** occupies a unique place in American music – where sea shanties, English music hall, play party songs, the spirit of early rock-n-roll, soul, North American and West Indian folk music collide. He has toured the world sharing handmade 21<sup>st</sup> century social music with enthusiastic crowds of kids and kid sympathizers. **Claudia Zanes** is a Haitian American music therapist / jazz vocalist / music program director. Together they have been making music since the day they met in the fall of 2016. Their love of songs and communal music-making lead to a publishing deal with the Quarto Group USA and the result, an award-winning songbook entitled *Dan Zanes' House Party: A Family Roots Music Treasury*, was released in 2018.
