LA BOTTINE SOURIANTE OCT. 5

The province of Quebec sends Washington a spirited ensemble, La Bottine Souriante, in an FSGW Special Event concert Saturday, Oct. 5 at Georgetown's Gaston Hall. The group's name means "The Smiling Boot," and their energetic, rhythmically complex music will justify the name by making your feet feel happy. La Bottine's songs come from the traditions of the Lanaudiere region north of Montreal. Their dance tunes are gathered from the vigorous fiddle and accordion music of Quebec province.

The quartet includes Daniel Roy on flute, jaw harp, bones, dulcimer, and Indian drum; Martin Racine on fiddle, mandolin, and feet; Yves Lambert on accordion and harmonica; and Bernard Simard on guitar. All four share vocals. The group are veterans of several albums and tours of Europe, the

U.S., and Canada.

The concert begins at 8:30 p.m. Gaston Hall is on the third floor of the Healy Building on the GU campus, 37th and O Streets NW. Admission is \$5.00 for FSGW members, \$7.00 for non-members.

SPECIAL EVENT OCT. 31 With MARTIN CARTHY

On Thursday, Oct. 31, FSGW will present a special concert by Martin Carthy and John Kirkpatrick from England. If you've never seen these two extraordinary performers in person, this is your chance to be knocked over by an evening of wonderful songs, spell-binding ballads, and delightful dance tunes that will have you capering up the aisles.

Martin Carthy is known to many as a former member of Steeleye Span and the Albion Country Band. More recently he has played with the Watersons and with Brass Monkey, and has toured solo as well as with Kirkpatrick. His influence as a singer and guitarist has been far-reaching, and he is widely regarded as one of the best musicians currently performing folk music.

John Kirkpatrick is another amazing musician, specializing in accordion, melodeon, and concertina. A list of those with whom he has played and recorded reads like a Who's Who of English folk music; his experience includes a stint with Steeleye Span and an important role in the famous electric album of Morris dance tunes, Morris On. He also performs with Sue Harris, and with the band

Umps and Dumps.

This is a Halloween treat not to be missed! The concert will be at the Hoover Auditorium of the Department of Commerce on 14th Street NW, between Constitution and Pennsylvania Avenues, at 8:30 p.m. Tickets are \$5 for FSGW members and \$7 for non-members, and are available in advance. Patsy Montana, Cathy Fink, and Liz Masterson will participate in two programs at the Smithsonian on Saturday and Sunday, Oct. 12 and 13. The Saturday event, titled "A Real Cowboy Girl: A Tribute to Women in Country Music," begins at 1:00 p.m. with "Cowgirl Culture," a discussion of the working lives and traditions of women in the West and their emergence as heroines of popular culture. The discussion will be led by Liz Masterson, cowgirl historian and performer from Denver. At 2:00, Patsy Montana will present an oral history, "I'd Love to Be a Cowgirl." Montana will discuss highlights of her carer as an originator of the singing cowgirl image and as the first woman in country music to have a million-selling record.
