Little Bit A Blues Turner & Lynn Foddrell Friday, November 11, 8:30pm

The Folklore Society of Greater Washington will feature two of the East Coast's finest blues duets in their November monthly program. Turner & Lynn Foddrell from Stuart, VA. and Maryland's finest *Little Bit A Blues*, featuring Warner Williams and Jay Summerour will present an evening of Piedmont-style blues and ragtime on Fri., Nov. 11 at the Washington Ethical Society auditorium.

Turner Foddrell is a supple and engaging finger style guitar player with a warm baritone voice and excellent store of traditional songs and tunes. He was born in 1928 into a respected musical family in Patrick county on the Virginia/North Carolina border. His father, Posey Foddrell, was a well-known local musician who played guitar and guitar-banjo at local dances and gatherings. Posey taught Turner the older traditional ballads and country dance tunes of their community in southern Virginia, as well as the blues, and other popular songs of the day. Turner has combined this older music with his own compositions and songs learned from recordings, to create a varied and eclectic repertoire crossing many stylistic boundaries. Turner has brought his eclectic repertoire and fine technique to audiences all over the east coast and was on staff this past year at the Augusta Heritage Workshops in Elkins, WV. Appearing with Turner will be his son Lynn, an excellent guitarist in his own right, who is learning from Turner, the music Turner learned from his father. When not playing music, Turner and Lynn run a general store near Stuart, VA in the community they have lived in all their lives.

The duo Little Bit A Blues is currently making a big name for themselves in the D.C. blues scene. Guitarist Warner Williams and harmonica player Jay Summerour have become favorites among local blues fans in the few short years they have been playing together. They have appeared at the Washington Folk Festival, the festival of American Folklife and at clubs and parties too numerous to name. Seventy year old Warner Williams has been a musician all of his life; however it is only in the past few years that local audiences have had the chance to appreciate his fine musicianship (thanks, in large part to local blues favorite, Eleanor Ellis). Like Turner Foddrell, Warner grew up in a musical family, learning blues, pop songs and country music from his father, brothers and cousins. He has appeared at the National Folk Festival, and at the folk masters series held at the Barns of Wolf Trap. He lives in Olney, MD and works for the state as a truck driver. Jay Summerour has been playing music since he was a small child, learning to play harmonica from his grandfather. He has played and toured with a variety of local rock and blues bands, including the *Starland Vocal Band* and the group *Silverspring*, but it is in playing the traditional down-home blues that he feels most comfortable. Jay lives in Poolesville, MD and drives a school bus when not playing music.

The Washington Ethical Society Auditorium is located at 7750 16th St. NW in Washington, DC. Admission to the 8:30pm concert is free to members of the Folklore Society. \$9 to the general public. You may join the society at the concert.

Steve Gillette and Cindy Mangsen Friday, November 18, 8pm

FSGW is delighted to present Steve Gillette and Cindy Mangsen at 8pm on Fri. Nov. 18 at the Ravensworth Baptist Church in Annandale, VA. Performing on guitar, concertina, banjo and fiddle, Steve and Cindy combine dynamic harmonies, instrumental virtuosity and dazzling vocal agility to captivate audiences of all



ages. The duo commands a wide range of styles and influences that fit comfortably within the folk idiom, including Depression-era folk, Irish jigs, nursery rhymes, British music hall, country ballads, Delta blues, novelty songs and Spanish poetry.

Steve Gillette is a country folk singer-songwriter with western roots. His guitar playing is a compendium of different styles and he sings in an honest and resonant baritone. However, he is best known as a songwriter of dumbfounding versatility, having penned classics from *Darcy Farrow* to *Dumbo*. *Broadside* says "He writes thoughtful, perceptive, unpretentious songs...he always keeps his subject in perspective, and by doing so refines the sensitivity of his listeners."

Cindy Mangsen has long been a favorite of fans who favor

traditional material, although her repertoire includes songs of contemporary songwriters and original songs as well. She's a delightful vocalist - her smooth, silky voice is utterly lacking in affectation and is colored by a natural vibrato. She delivers her songs with a deceptive economy and a beauty that recalls Judy Collins and Joan Baez. She's also a triple-threat instrumentalist, accomplished on guitar, banjo and concertina.

Together since 1989, this husband and wife team weave their love for their music into a tapestry of sound that embraces one and all. They have delighted audiences across the United States and Europe with their world-class level of professionalism and their down-home, informal charm. Traditional Singing Workshop with Jerry Epstein November 19 - 20

We have all had the experience of hearing someone with a beautiful singing voice whose singing fails to hold our attention, while a singer with a rough voice may captivate us completely, Why is this so? We will be exploring this phenomenon when Jerry Epstein leads a workshop for singers Sat. Nov. 19 and Sun. Nov. 20 at the home of Judy and Dennis Cook in Laurel, MD. Jerry has run these sessions at folk festivals, at Pinewoods Music Camp, in private classes and for folk music societies throughout the Northeast for over 15 years. The workshop runs Sat. and Sun. starting at 9:30am, with morning and afternoon sessions of about 21/2 hours each. Attendance is limited to 9 so each participant can work on a different song in each sessions. The workshop is run clinic-style. Each participant sings a song; the others give their immediate reactions. Jerry helps the singer examine the song and explore the stylistic possibilities that could improve the communication of the song with a minimum of distraction. Timing will be emphasized. Discussions of decoration to provide emphasis and expression will grow from examples of songs brought by participants. These are sessions for singers; participants should have some repertoire of songs and they should be able to sing. Instrumental accompaniment is welcome, although participants will be encouraged to sing unaccompanied, at least at first. The fee is \$50 for both days or \$35 for one day. 
