

Cathy Winter House Concert Sunday, December 4, 7:30pm



Cathy Winter of Albany, New York, one of the most versatile, talented singer-songwriters on the national folk scene, pays a visit to the Washington area on Sun. Dec. 4 at 7:30pm for a house concert at the home of Ursy Potter and Carter Hearn in McLean, VA. An accomplished guitarist rooted in country blues and early jazz, Winter's performances are a sassy mix of swing, blues, traditional folk standards, ragtime, country and Tin Pan Alley, as well as her own finely crafted original songs. In addition to being a singer with a beautifully clear, powerful voice, she is also a first-rate storyteller who uses her body and music to tell folk tales, creating characters and voices out of the fabric of American experience.

Cathy Winter's gift for establishing an immediate rapport with the audience is certain to warm the early December night. Admission to this special event is \$5 (FSGW) and \$8 (non-members). Refreshments will be served. For directions, call 703-821-1373.

FSGW SUNDAY NIGHT DANCES

Glen Echo Park, Spanish Ballroom 7:30 - 10:30 PM

Beginning in December we move to our winter home at Cherry Hill Park, 9800 Cherry Hill Road, College Park, Maryland. The hall was built for dancing, with a 60' by 60' suspended wood floor and good acoustics. Directions: Take the Beltway to exit 25B (Route 1 South). At the second light (1/10 mile) turn right onto Cherry Hill Road. Go one mile until you see the park on your left. Turn left and follow the entrance road one block past a stop sign to a T intersection. Turn right and park near (or past) the clubhouse. If you're lost call (301) 595-7181. Remember: Drive slowly and carefully in the park. Avoid blocking campsites and remember that people are trying to sleep when we leave. Please remember to bring a pair of clean, soft soled shoes to change into for dancing.  Becky Tracy's astounding fiddle playing combines with the intricate accordion playing of Jeremiah Maclane and Keith Murphy's piano and guitar to provide what one dancer called "Northern dance music the way it's supposed to be played: power, style and dimension.

New Year's Eve Contra Ball Saturday, December 31, 8pm

Evening Star is on the horizon for this year's New Year's Eve Contra Ball in a rare reunion appearance of this scintillating band featuring musicians Steve Hickman, John Devine and Claudio Buchwald, all the way from Indiana. As if that weren't enough, Bill Tomczak gilds the lily with a guest appearance on his clarinet. Susan Kevra, one of New England's premier callers, will preside over the festivities.

The dance will be held at the Leland Community Center, 4301 Willow Lane, Bethesda, from 8:00 PM to 12:45 AM. Light refreshments will be served throughout the evening, and there will be a champagne/sparkling cider toast at midnight. Preregistrations will be accepted until December 23. New Alborada in Concert Friday, December 9, 8:30pm

The Folklore Society's December membership program will feature an evening of Andean folk music on Fri. Dec. 9 at the WES Auditorium. The group *New Alborada*, a Washington based band, well-known to local audiences for their street-corner performances, will present this ancient, flute-driven, South American music. Tickets for the 8:30pm concert are free to FSGW members, \$9 for non-members.

New Alborada is a four person group who play the traditional music of the Andes, a high rugged mountain range in western South America. Andean music combines ancient music played by native people in the Andes long before the arrival of



Europeans to the Americas with elements and instruments brought by the Spanish colonizers, and newer musical forms popular in South America today. The music is driven by Pan flutes called Sikus and a notched flute, the Quena. These are backed by large drums called bombos and by a variety of stringed instruments modeled on the European guitar, including the charrango, cuatro and tiple.

New Alborada was formed by brothers Marco and Andres Mallea in 1982 with the goal of introducing the misc and culture of their native Bolivia to audiences in the United States. They have performed at numerous festivals and concerts on local streets. In addition to Marco (who plays guitar, percussion and sings) and Andres (who sings and plays Pan flute, Quena, guitar and percussion), the band includes Misael Saracho (who plays Pan flutes and Quenas) and Omar Martinez (who plays percussion, guitar and Pan flutes).

The concert will be held at the Washington Ethical Society auditorium, located at 7750 16th St. NW in Washington, D.C. Non-members wishing to join the folklore society may do so the evening of the concert.

Les Sampou House Concert Saturday, December 10, 8:30pm



Les Sampou, winner of the 1994 prestigious Kerrville New Folk Award, will bring her exciting mix of roadhouse blues and folk ballads to an intimate house concert at the home of Dudley Thompson in Silver Spring, MD., on Sat. Dec. 10 at 8:30pm. For someone whose debut CD has been out for just one year, Sampou is attracting a lot of attention. Her elegant poetry sets her apart; the trick to her writing is in the detail. She has fashioned a unique, attention-grabbing bluesy sound that brings to mind such legends as Joni Mitchell and Bonnie Raitt. Sampou has appeared in clubs and coffeehouses all over New England and has worked with such well known folk singers as John Gorka, Cheryl Wheeler, Patty Larkin and Pete Seeger. Sampou knows American music history and translates that knowledge into her own style with ease, as she plays everything from authentic blues to contemporary and original material.
