Scandinavian Fiddle Music Andrea Hoag and Bruce Sagan Friday, November 10, 8:30 pm

The FSGW November membership program will be an evening of Scandinavian music featuring two of the best performers in this varied style in the United States. **Andrea Hoag** and **Bruce Sagan** are long time students of the fiddle styles of Norway and Sweden thus bringing a thorough understanding and deep love of these music to the concert stage. They will appear at the Unitarian Universalist Church of Silver Spring, MD. on Fri. Nov. 10 at 8:30 pm.

Andrea Hoag and Bruce Sagan are two of the best known and most respected performers of traditional Scandinavian music in the United States. Performing on fiddle, button accordion, nyckelharpa (a Swedish fiddle with keys) and hardingfele (a Norwegian fiddle with sympathetic strings lying under the fingerboard), among other instruments; the duo performs tunes and songs from a variety of regional styles, ranging from Swedish polskas and waltzes to the wild improvisational music of Norway.

Andrea, a resident of Takoma Park, has been playing the fiddle for twenty years, learning tunes and techniques from master fiddlers on numerous trips to Sweden and Norway. She has earned the respect of these older players and her music has been described in a Swedish publication as "deeply rooted in the Swedish soul." In addition to her playing, Andrea is also a master teacher, having graduated from a Swedish Folk college course in Violin Pedagogy. She has taught at music camps across the US, and for seven years led a Swedish spelmanslag, or musicians group in Seattle, WA. Adept at many styles, Andrea also plays contra dance music with local favorites, the *Future Geezers*.

Bruce Sagan of Lansing, MI has also learned his music over several trips to Sweden and Norway. He recently spent a year living in Sweden, collecting tunes and performing at



concerts and festivals. Like Andrea, he is a master teacher, having organized a spelmanslag in Lansing to train aspiring fiddlers. He has made one instructional video and had taught at dance camps across the country. He and Andrea have recorded one album together, released on the ETD label. At the concert, Bruce and Andrea will be accompanied by bouzouki player **Larry Robinson**, who also plays on their album.

Harmony by Ear Workshop December 9 & 10, 1995

Jerry Epstein will be leading another of his famous weekend workshops on Dec 9 & 10, 1995 at the home of Judy & Dennis Cook. This one will be for those who want to work on singing harmony by ear. Unlike other typical sessions, Jerry will not teach parts by rote. Instead participants will work in twos with one singing a tune so that the other can experiment with harmony. We will begin to feel our way around the scale finding patterns and bits of harmony that work with standard bits of tune. As always, Jerry will be expanding our consciousness, though this is a voices-on class, a little theory and some ideas of modal scales, pivotal notes and how one can use them to create exciting harmony on the spot will be brought in as appropriate.

To participate profitably, one needs to be able to carry a tune with security when others are singing. No previous knowledge of theory or harmony is assumed, but any experience experimenting with harmonies is fine.
