# Contra Dancing With Beginners

(Second in a series of two on contra dance etiquette by Laura Brown, a well-known DC area contra dance caller)

In last month's article, I encouraged dancers to actively invite newcomers to join our community by dancing with them. If you have decided to try this out, here are some helpful hints to help make these dances more enjoyable for you and your less experienced partner:

1. Attitude: While it is true that a first-time dancer's swing (etc.) may not be perfect, don't think of this as "sacrificing" a good time. What you get instead is the genuine excitement sharing a new dancer's discovery of something new and wonderful, as you introduce them to the joy of dancing. So relax, and enjoy the tradeoff.

2. *Take the lead* (women, too): You have to think like a caller, anticipating what the next move is and helping your partner get ready for it. Physically and verbally point your partner in the right direction (but try not to push).

3. "*Ripping my arm out*": Some experienced dancers have expressed concern about getting hurt. If someone is being rough, tell them! Whether the person is a beginner or more experienced, don't get hurt and then let that dancer go on to the next person and repeat the mistake! Most beginners (and many experienced dancers) are willing to take helpful hints if presented respectfully.

4. *Embellishments*: A twirl is NOT standard after a ladies chain. Please don't teach it to beginners. They have enough to worry about in the dance without being disoriented by being twirled or having a whirling dervish twirl under their arm. Please remember this etiquette: the gent offers a twirl, and the lady accepts or declines. If she declines, gents, put your other arm around her, look deeply into her eyes (something you can't do in a twirl) and turn her courteously.

And please don't change a dance on a beginner (for example, turning a do-si-do into swing). For the beginner's sake, do the dance the way the caller teaches it.

Be patient, and, MOST IMPORTANT, have fun!






