

The Man Who Invented The Christmas Revels

Saturday, November 10 8 pm

John "Jack" Langstaff is in every sense one of traditional music's great voices. His singing is infused with the love and understanding that come from a career that spans more than sixty years. Born in Brooklyn, he remembers musical gatherings featur-

ing folk songs as a regular part of his family life. Both his parents sang, and Jack was a promising boy soprano soloist.

Jack first attended the White Top Festival (North Carolina) and Pinewoods Camp in 1934. Not quite twenty years later, he started the first Folk Music Week, out of which grew so many of folk music societies. He is a life-long educator and singer, and a staunch advocate of the place traditional music, dance, and movement should have in the lives of children. Thanks to his teaching, his books, and his establishment of Folk Music Week and the Revels, Jack may be responsible for getting more people involved in music than anyone alive (with the possible exception of Pete Seeger).

Jack brings magic to his performances, and leads the listener into song and the folk tradition with true inspiration. **Jerry Epstein** will accompany Jack on concertina, guitar, and piano.

Bring your voices and be ready to get up and dance. You won't be able to resist!

Beth Molaro has been calling since 1992; her quick, no-nonsense walk-throughs and effective teaching lower the learning curve, and she calls high energy dances specializing in rip-roaring squares and contras that make you go "ahhhhhhhhh contradance heaven!!"



Wayne Henderson

Fingerpicking Guitar Master Saturday, November 17 8 pm

On Saturday, November 17, FSGW's *free* monthly membership program will feature one of the best fingerpicking guitar players in the country, Virginia native **Wayne Henderson**. Wayne comes from Grayson County, Virginia, an area of the Blue Ridge Mountains known for its guitarists and for its fine instrument makers. Wayne, a resident of Rugby, Virginia (population 100) is both.

A guitar player since the age of five, Wayne learned chords and tunes from musician neighbors Katherine and Blair Reedy. He was also influenced by the great Rugby guitarist Estil Ball. A Blue Ridge radio favorite, Ball performed in a string band with Wayne's father, fiddler Walter Henderson. "Any good guitar player uses fingerpicks," Ball told young Wayne. "Don't ever fool with a flatpick." He never has. Some of Wayne's playing may sound like flat-



picking, but it's not. An evening with Wayne is sure to include lots of Carter Family tunes, as well as old-time fiddle tunes, rags, and reels learned from his fiddle-playing father and from guitar-picking friends like Doc Watson.

In addition to his guitar playing, Wayne has been a guitar maker since the age of 14, drawing inspiration and help from Albert Hash, a Rugby violin and fretted instrument maker whose instruments were a local legend. Wayne and his partner, Gerald Anderson, now make some of the most sought-after guitars and mandolins in this country.

Wayne has toured nationally with the National Council for the Traditional Arts' "Masters of the Steel-String Guitar" tour. He was honored for his instrument making in 1995 with a prestigious National Heritage Fellowship from the National Endowment for the Arts. He has made a number of recordings, which will be available at the concert.

Don't miss this rare opportunity to hear one of guitar-picking's all-time greats. If you're an FSGW member (or if you join FSGW at the concert), admission is FREE; nonmember admission is \$15. The concert begins at 8:00 p.m. at the Washington Ethical Society auditorium, 7750 16th St. NW (just south of the D.C.-Md. line, Directions on page 14).

CP55 Scholarship Fund in Memory of Mary Kay Friday






DIRECTIONS TO FREQUENT VENUES:

Washington Ethical Society (WES)

Auditorium. 7750 16th St., NW, just south of the intersection of Kalmia Rd. and 16th St., about four blocks inside the DC/MD line.

From the Beltway: Take the Georgia Avenue South exit. Stay in either right lane. Go 0.4 miles from the exit ramp, where the right lanes curve and put you on 16th St South. Follow 16th past East-West Hwy (Rte 410); cross the MD/DC line at Portal Dr. Kalmia Road is the first traffic signal south of the line, and WES is the second building on the right after you cross Kalmia. You may park on Kalmia Road by turning right at the light, or on either side of 16th St.

Spanish Ballroom, Glen Echo Park. 7300 MacArthur Blvd. at Goldsboro Rd, in Glen Echo, MD. The Ballroom is the large building (no exterior sign), located next to the playground and near the carousel.



From the Beltway:

MARYLAND SIDE: at 2-lane Exit 40 take the left fork for Cabin John Parkway. Where Cabin John merges with Clara Barton Pkwy, move into the left lane, under the overhang.

VIRGINIA SIDE: get into the far right hand lane at the top of the bridge. At the first fork, bear right.

Stay in the left lane; watch for Cabin John traffic merging from the right at the overhang.

MD/VA: Watch for signs to MacArthur Blvd. Make a very sharp hairpin turn and move immediately into the right lane. At the T intersection/stop sign, turn left onto MacArthur Blvd. Upper parking lot on the left. For lower parking lot, go around the small traffic circle and make the first left onto Oxford St.

By public transportation: Take the #29 bus from the Friendship Heights Metro Station. Ask the driver to let you know when to get off for Glen Echo Park. The bus stops running before the dance ends. Ask the dance coordinator to announce you need a ride. We've never left anybody at the park. Last bus leaves Friendship Heights Metro at 7:30 pm.

Glen Echo Town Hall 6106 Harvard St., Glen Echo, MD: From the Beltway:


