Mando Mafia have been delighting audiences with their award winning

Mando Mafia have been delighting audiences with their award winning "wall-of-mandolin" sound, playing concerts, music and art festivals, dances and dance weekends, wine festivals, weddings, parties and other special events in the mid-Atlantic states since 1989. Their recordings have been heard on National Public Radio's

All Things Considered and played on radio shows all over the US and as far away as France and Australia.

Though the band's music has its roots in Appalachian old-timey string band traditions, it has branches just about everywhere. A typical performance might, in addition to old-time hoedown music, include calypso, reggae, rockabilly, klezmer and bluegrass, together with the occasional Finnish wedding march, Chilean *sikureada*, Puerto Rican or Argentine waltz, and Italian polka.

No strangers to competition, individual band members have won instrumental contests in Maryland, Virginia and North Carolina; collectively the band has won the non-traditional band competition at West Virginia's Appalachian String Band Festival (and also placed in the top three numerous times).

In the words of music promoter Fred Boyce: "With a repertoire as broad as that of the mandolin itself...the Mando Mafia stand poised to entertain, delight and instruct. They can be uproariously happy and bright at one moment, and then turn right around and deliver a somber rendering of something that

sounds as though it just got off the boat from the Old Country. The *Mando Mafia* is definitely one group of 'dons' you should seek out at every opportunity."



Junction of Folk, Swing, and the Roots of Jazz Saturday, February 21 • 8pm Guy Van Duser and Billy Novick transcend the limits of any particular genre while displaying a deep musi-

cal understanding of the forms and traditions of blues, swing, Celtic music, New Orleans jazz, and one or two novelties that they keep up their sleeves. Masters of their instruments, these guys can do just about anything. Van Duser's finger-style "stride" guitar and Novick's clarinet and alto sax (or pennywhistle) can play it straight or go places these sounds aren't usually found, such as Van Duser's solo guitar version of "Stars and Stripes Forever"

or Novick's pennywhistle rendition of "Rhapsody in Blue."

Guy Van Duser is arguably the best finger-style guitar player living in the United States. Simultaneously playing bass lines, chords, and melody, he has elevated the swing-style guitar from its traditional rhythmic-accompaniment, leaving audiences amazed that so much music can come from a single guitar. With his daring imagination, breathtaking technique, and his wonderful musicality, he has become an inspiration for guitarists all over the world.

Billy Novick plays clarinet, tin whistles, and saxophone (and even sings in-between). His warm, aged-in-thewood tone, huge dynamic range, and lyrical melody sense make him one of the most exciting woodwind players around today. Novick's inventive and soulful clarinet playing provides the ideal complement to Van Duser's guitar.

A duo since 1976, their long partnership has allowed them to develop a musical telepathy, and they keep their musical marriage fresh by constantly playing off each other. They've performed at folk festivals, have been featured on A Prairie Home Companion, and can be heard on movie soundtracks and theme songs for PBS shows.



The festival had been scheduled, but two things conspired to force us to cancel this popular fundraising event. Most importantly, no one stepped forward to volunteer to coordinate the Mini-Fest. Those we asked were unable to make the commitment this year. As we were struggling to find a willing volunteer, Montgomery County informed the Board that they had mistakenly double-booked the space at Takoma Park Middle School for the date we had reserved, and that we would need to find another venue. The two factors led us to reluctantly concede that the Mini-Fest could not be pulled together in the limited time remaining before its scheduled date.

To assure that the Mini-Fest can return next winter, we need to start thinking NOW about organizing it. Can you work on programming dance, crafts, or musical performances? Can you help recruit volunteers? manage food vendors? the instrument check room? are you a whiz with organizing? We need you! 



Washington Ethical Society (WES)

Auditorium. 7750 16th St., NW, just south of the intersection of Kalmia Rd. and 16th St., about four blocks inside the DC/MD line.

From the Beltway: Take the Georgia Avenue South exit. Stay in either right lane. Go 0.4 miles from the exit ramp, where the right lanes curve and put you on 16th St South. Follow 16th past East-West Hwy (Rte 410); cross the MD/DC line at Portal Dr. Kalmia Road is the first traffic signal south of the line, and WES is the second building on the right after you cross Kalmia. You may park on Kalmia Road by turning right at the light, or on either side of 16th St.



Spanish Ballroom/Bumper Car Pavilion, Glen Echo Park. 7300 MacArthur Blvd. at Goldsboro Rd, in Glen Echo, MD.

The Bumper Car Pavilion is located just past and to the

right of the carousel. From the Beltway:

MARYLAND SIDE: at 2-lane Exit 40 take the left fork for Cabin John Parkway. Where Cabin John merges with Clara Barton Pkwy, move into the left lane, under the overhang. VIRGINIA SIDE: get into the far right hand lane at the top of the bridge. At the first fork, bear right. Stay in the left lane; watch for Cabin John traffic merging from the right at the overhang.

MD/VA: Watch for signs to MacArthur Blvd. Make a very sharp hairpin turn and move immediately into the right lane. 

35 Years Ago — February 1969

The February 14 FSGW program at the Washington Ethical Society featured Tom Paley. The two-page February 1969 newsletter (volume 5, number 6) announced this event, a Sacred Harp sing, future events, and Bill Harrell & Don Reno's weekly appearances on WTTG-TV. A 20-page Newsletter Supplement also appeared this month containing articles "Water & Sand, the Anatomy of a Folk Belief" by Frank Goodwyn and "Hunting and Taming the Native American (Or Hammered) Dulcimer" by Richard Hulan, an announcement of expanded folklore courses at the University of Maryland with newly arrived Professor **Gladys-Marie Fry**, a history of the FSGW logo, twelve book reviews and notices, and a record review.

The following were also scheduled to appear in the Washington area this month: **Peter Paul & Mary**; Ali Akbar Khan & Mahapurush Misra; Tim Hardin; Country Gentlemen: Currie Family; Bill Emerson, Cliff Waldron & The Lee Highway Boys; Bob Goff & The Bluegrass Buddies, Bill Monroe; Green County Ramblers; Page Valley Boys; Francis Tinsman & The Potomac Valley Boys.

Meanwhile, the Library of Congress Archive of Folk Song reported the acquisition of 88 tapes recorded in Louisiana, Nova Scotia and Newfoundland by Ralph Rinzler, and the duplication of 47 renditions of "Sally Goodin" for Earl Spielman's dissertation at the University of Wisconsin. They received queries from Senator George S. McGovern concerning "If I Had a Hammer" and from Congressman Daniel J. Flood concerning "The Times They Are A-Changing," and reported the following visitors: Hazel Buchbinder (Fish Creek, WI); Michael Cooney (Falls Church); Halim El-Dabh (Howard University); William Foshag (Washington, DC); David Peterson (University of Wisconsin); Mrs. Arthur Schrader (Singing History Inc.); Frank Warner (Glen Head, NY); Elliot Wigginton (Foxfire).
