
The FSGW Mini-Fest is a family-friendly extravaganza of music, dance, stories, workshops, and crafts. Some of the area's finest musicians will show off their virtuosic skills, but there will also be opportunities to share music with neighbors, or to try your hand jamming in a new style.

During the day, we'll offer concerts in bluegrass, blues, and ballads, from the Baltics to the Balkans and beyond. Or try your hand at dancing—everything from Morris dancing to Romanian and Armenian dances will be offered in the Dance Room. No matter what your skill level, you can jam the blues with folks from *Archie Edwards' Barbershop*, or play Irish music with members of the *Irish Breakfast Band*, or sing sea chanteys with *Ship's*

Company. Storytellers will hold forth all day in one room and traditional American singers in another. Yet another room will offer Roots/Americana music—everything from bluegrass to country. We haven't forgotten children and the inner child in all of us: Andy Cooper will lead traditional singing games, and Jim Bunch will show how to make musical instruments from found objects. The Folklore Society of Greater Washington will take a celebratory look at itself on its 40th anniversary.

An evening concert will feature the wild and authentic modern Klezmer music of *Klezcentricity* (David Julian Gray, Wendy Morrison, and Richard Seidel), and Nicholas Sironka's troupe of Kenyan Masai villagers (who we've



Classic Blues was the first blues — the first blues to be recorded for popular consumption. It was grounded in folk blues combined with vaudeville styling. It was almost exclusively performed by women who were unashamed to lay their souls bare, unafraid to give advice. **Gaye Adegbalola & Roddy Barnes** embrace and redefine this style as Neo-Classic Blues. Their performances feature songs from **Bessie Smith**, **Ma Rainey**, **Sippie Wallace** and others. They are also likely to include some of **Gaye's** original songs.

Award-winning singer/songwriter/vocalist **Gaye Adegbalola's** musical roots run deep. As a founding (and current) member of **Saffire-The Uppity Blues Women**, **Gaye** not only rediscovered the blues she first met as a child, she put her stamp on them. In addition to performing and recording with **Saffire** and releasing a solo CD, **Gaye** presents numerous lectures and workshops at colleges and blues society. Her presentation "History of Women in Blues" led to development of her duet act with **Roddy Barnes**.

Gaye says in an article on her website, "I decided that I would insert selected songs into the presentation and I would perform them live...with piano accompaniment pre-recorded." She goes on to say "I knew that an incredible piano player, **Roddy Barnes**, had moved to my area a few months earlier. He moved from Missouri to New Orleans to Austin pursuing his profession. Roddy, who is classically trained, can play any genre, but he really has that old-timey sound down. Turns out that he was influenced early on by **Bessie Smith's** pianists." At the recording session "....we listened and listened, again and again. We had something that we truly loved."

Gaye and Roddy's CD *Neo-Classic Blues*, was released May 2004 and was described by Mike Joyce in the *Washington Post* as "primarily devoted to the 'classic blues' era of the '20s and '30s, the duet performances celebrate the seminal role women played in making the music popular, enduring and in some cases, indelible."

The monthly program is FREE to FSGW members and \$15 for non-members, though you're welcome to join FSGW at the door. Gordon Bok grew up around the boatyards of Camden, Maine, where he started singing and playing guitar at an early age, inspired by both his musical family and his coastal environment. He worked on or near the water much of his earlier years, in shipyards and on sailing vessels, serving in every capacity from dishwasher to captain.

Bok's music is largely self-taught. His mastery of both 6- and 12-string guitars and his well-developed vocal expression create an unmistakable style that has made him one of our most cherished folk artists. Gordon returns to FSGW for a Special Event concert Wednesday, March 2, at the Unitarian Universalist Church of Silver Spring, MD

Gordon's repertoire -- a rich trove of Maine and Maritime ballads, songs from abroad, stories of boats and sailors, tales of seal-folk and songs and cante-fables of his own composition -- have been recorded on over thirty albums, both solo and with other musicians. Scott Alarik of *Sing Out* magazine writes, "There is something deeply rooted, ancient and timeless to his songs, yet he is an utter original."

Old Time Music, Stories, and Poetry from Alaska

Wednesday, February 2 • 7:30 pm (note early start time!)

Ken Waldman has drawn on his 18 years in Alaska to produce poems, stories and fiddle tunes, resulting in a unique performance that combines Alaskan tales and poetry with old-time Appalachian fiddle music.

A former college professor, Waldman has had more than 400 poems and stories published in national journals, and has worked full-time since 1994 as Alaska's Fiddling Poet, performing at some of the nation's leading clubs, bookstores, universities and arts festivals.

Waldman spent time teaching writing over the telephone at the Nome campus of the University of Alaska Fairbanks. Then there was the 1996 plane crash that led locals to refer to him as "a walking dead man." He draws on his personal history and mixes it with observations on bush life to create a very Alaskan vision in his spoken works. His love of old-time fiddling has led him to master the old tunes and occasionally compose new ones in the old style. Besides concert situations, he works regularly in classrooms (and will arrive that evening directly from teaching in a Montgomery County school.)
