## ENGLISH FOLK CLUB NIGHT with Gwily

Davies

Thursday, July 21 • 8 pm

Dennis and Judy Cook invite FSGW members and friends to their home in Laurel, MD, for another English Folk Club night, featuring Gwilym Davies, the singer of English songs with the Welsh name. He's from Hampshire, and lives in Gloucestershire. He is an experienced singer of traditional songs, both acappella and self-accompanied on melodeon, concerti-

na, banjo or guitar. For over 30 years, Gwilym has been tracking down and recording traditional singers; more than half his repertoire is based on that material. Many of his songs were learned first hand from the English traveler (gypsy) community. Most of his English songs come from England's south and south-west, and he has also collected material on his trips to the U.S.

What's an English Folk Club Night? Expect a house concert with the flavor of an English folk club at a pub, soda and crisps (that's "chips" in American), floor singers (contact Judy in advance if you want to be one of them), even a raffle at the interval (that's "intermission" in American). Bring your own beer, preferably at an appropriate temperature. Suggested minimum donation: \$5. And bring a few extra dollars for the raffle - it all goes to the special guest.

## DANNS SPOONER

Traditional & Contemporary folks songs of Britian and Australia

Wednesday, August 3 • 8 pm

Danny Spooner is a singer of traditional and contemporary folk songs of Britain and Australia – a cappella, or with guitar and concertina. He is known as a singer of shanties and labor songs. For 30 years Australian audiences have enjoyed his concerts and workshops, his deep multi-disciplinary understanding of social history, his personal warmth, and his immense repertoire of songs. He was born in London, England and emigrated to Australia in 1962. His biography includes time in the theatre and a maritime past where he apprenticed as a Thames lighterman and worked his way up to North Sea trawlers and South Georgia whalers. Thanks to a prodigious memory and a willingness to learn about his craft, Danny Spooner quickly developed into one of the best singers of British folksongs in Australia. His repertoire spans almost every part of the British tradition as well as a respectable portion of the Australian.

Danny has performed in folk clubs all over Australia, New Zealand and Britain, and has appeared at every major folk festival in Australia. His passion is getting people singing, and he has inspired and encouraged many in developing their craft. 



**Auditorium. 7750 16th St., NW**, just south of the intersection of Kalmia Rd. and 16th St., about four blocks inside the DC/MD line.

From the Beltway: Take the Georgia Avenue South exit. Stay in either right lane. Go 0.4 miles from the exit ramp, where the right lanes curve and put you on 16th St South. Follow 16th past East-West Hwy (Rte 410); cross the MD/DC line at Portal Dr. Kalmia Road is the first traffic signal south of the line, and WES is the second building on the right after you cross Kalmia. You may park on Kalmia Road by turning right at the light, or on either side of 16th St.

By Metro: Red Line to Silver Spring. Exit and walk southwest on Colesville Road two blocks to the traffic circle; cross 16th Street, then walk south 4 blocks on 16th Street to the Washington Ethical Society, 7750 16th St., the second building on the right after Kalmia Road, NW. If you'd rather not walk, an S-4 Metrobus will deliver you to the corner of Kalmia Rd. and 16th St.

Spanish Ballroom/Bumper Car Pavilion, Glen Echo Park. 7300 MacArthur Blvd. at Goldsboro Rd, in Glen Echo, MD.



The Bumper Car Pavilion is located just past and to the right of the carousel. From the Beltway: MARYLAND SIDE: at 2-lane Exit 40 take the left fork for Cabin John Parkway. Where

Pkwy, move into the left lane, under the overhang.

**VIRGINIA SIDE:** get into the far right hand lane at the top of the bridge. At the first fork, bear right. Stay in the left lane; watch for Cabin John traffic merging from the right at the overhang.

MD/VA: Watch for signs to MacArthur Blvd. Make a very sharp hairpin turn and move immediately into the right lane. Glen Echo Town Hall 6106 Harvard St., Glen Echo, MD: From the Beltway:

MARYLAND SIDE: at 2-lane Exit 40 take the left fork for Cabin John Parkway. Where Cabin John merges with Clara Barton Pkwy, move into the left lane, under the overhang. VIRGINIA SIDE: get into the far right hand lane at the top of the bridge. At the first fork, bear right. Stay in the left lane; watch for Cabin John traffic merging from the right at the overhang. MD/VA: Watch for signs to MacArthur Blvd. Make a very sharp hairpin turn and move immediately into the right lane. 

#### What is the Getaway?

For four decades, FSGW has held its Getaway weekend so that members and friends can share music, stories, crafts and dance in a relaxed camp setting.

#### The Getaway is:

- Music-making under the trees, on the lawn, by the pond, or in a cabin;
- · Group singing and jamming at its best;
- Informal workshops on singing, dancing, crafts and storytelling led by FSGW members and friends;
- Trying a craft—quilting, basket-making, puppets, and mask-making have been highlights of past years;
- Great food
- A terrific weekend for the whole family, with lots of special children's activities:
- · A chance to renew old friendships and make new ones;
- A beautiful camp with modern facilities in scenic rolling hills adjacent to the Susquehanna River;
- A wonderful chance for parents to introduce their kids to the magic of group singing and dancing—or to discover that magic for the first time themselves.

#### Dates and Times

This year's Getaway is scheduled at the height of Fall colors. Camp Ramblewood spreads out over rolling hill-sides bordering the Susquehanna River just below the Conowingo Dam, north of Havre de Grace, Maryland. Camp Ramblewood is about 8 miles north of Exits 89 (Havre de Grace) or 93 (Port Deposit) of I-95. It's only 90 minutes North of the I-495 Beltway, in a direction far less subject to traffic jams than Virginia. You may choose to stay over either one, two, or three nights, or you may come for the day if you are unable to get away for the whole weekend. There is also the possibilty of coming for the day without meals. (You must register in advance if you wish to dine!)

The weekend starts Friday evening with a potluck dinner. If you register for two nights, your registration fee covers three meals and a midnight snack both days on Saturday and Sunday. Three-night registration gives you an additional night's lodging and breakfast on Monday

morning. One-night registration gives you all meals and snacks on either Saturday or Sunday and, if you wish, a bed on either adjacent night.

#### **Facilities**

The dining hall, several common rooms, the pub, the drama barn, the dance barn (with a hardwood sprung floor), and the outdoor pavilion offer all-weather spaces for music making and dancing. NO SMOKING is allowed in any of the camp buildings.

If you choose to go to bed, there are more than 50 rooms, mostly in modern cabins. They feature indoor flush plumbing and hot showers; comfortable beds with boxspring mattresses (bring your own linens and bedding). The buildings are not centrally heated, but we may bring electric space heaters, as long as we don't overload the fuse capacity of any individual cabin. There are handicapped-accessible cabins with wheelchair-accessible bathrooms for those who need them; please indicate any special needs when you register. If you prefer to bring a tent or your own RV, you may do so, and camp on the grounds (no discounts, but you get guaranteed privacy!). If you don't want to sing, there's a pond with boats (and stocked with fish), tennis courts, ball fields, and a trail through the woods to the banks of the Susquehanna. The immediate area offers antiques, history and horse farms. (See more of Camp Ramblewood at its website: www.ramblewood.com.)

#### Fees

Getaway fees depend on whether you're an FSGW member or not, and whether you're an adult or a child. See the registration form for the fee that applies to you. Fees are determined by our actual costs to run this event—food, camp rental, etc. We try to keep them as low as possible while still allowing the event to cover its costs.
