Join the very much alive *Double Decker String Band* as they celebrate the release of their 6th album: *The Rest is Yet to Come*. There is a delicious irony in having a brand new digital recording of "...voices that sound as though they were lifted intact from old 78's..." (**Richard Harrington** - *The Washington Post*), but where better to hear one of the country's best old-time bands than in one of their rare live concerts!

The Double Decker String Band has been playing and singing old-time music under that name since 1977. The band's major inspiration comes from vintage recordings of the Southern string bands who dominated the country music industry in the 1920's and 1930's. Sources include the Georgia Yellow Hammers, Carter Brothers and Son, and the Alabama Shieks. All of the members of Double Decker are vocalists and versatile instrumentalists, allowing the band to employ a wide variety of vocal arrangements and instrumental lineups.

You'll get a good taste of that diversity at the upcoming concert, including a wide range of traditional styles on banjo, guitar, fiddle, and vocals. In a fresh and playful manner, *Double Decker* presents old-time tunes and songs ranging from sentimental to silly, sacred to secular. Their music is always approachable, authentic, and inventive, freed by their incredible grounding in the tradition.

The band's members (Bill Schmidt, Craig Johnson, Bruce Hutton and John Beam) are dispersed throughout Maryland and down to North Carolina, and this four-piece powerhouse of a band performs irregularly, making their FSGW concert a special treat. Other appearances have included The Smithsonian Institute, the Brandywine Mountain Music Convention, Merlefest, the Library of Congress, and Garrison Keillor's "A Prairie Home Companion." With many of their earlier albums now out of print, a new CD will be a welcome souvenir of a delightful evening.


42nd Annual Getaway with Old Friends to a New Site November 3-5, 2006 West River Conference Center



Spanish Ballroom/Bumper Car Pavilion

7300 MacArthur Blvd. Åt Goldsboro Rd., Glen Echo, MD

The Bumper Car Pavilion is located just past and to the right of the Carousel. The Spanish Ballroom is to the right of the Bumper Car Pavilion.

FROM THE BELTWAY:

Maryland Side: at 2-lane Exit 40 take the left fork for the Cabin John Parkway. Where Cabin John merges with the Clara Barton Parkway, move into the left lane, under the overhang.

Virginia side: Get into the far right hand lane at the top of the bridge. At the first fork, bear right. Stay in the left lane; watch for Cabin John traffic merging from the right at the overhang.

MD&VA: Watch for signs to MacArthur Blvd. Make a very sharp hairpin turn and move immediately into the right lane. At the T intersection/stop sign, turn left onto MacArthur Blvd. The Upper parking lot is on the left. For the lower parking lot, go around the small traffic circle and make the first left onto Oxford St.

By Public Transportation: Take the #29 Bus from the Friendship Heights Metro Station. Ask the driver to let you know when to get off for Glen Echo Park. The bus stops running before the last dance ends. Ask the dance coordinator to announce that you need a ride. We've never left anybody at the Park. Last bus leaves Friendship Heights Metro at 7:30 pm. *In the event of inclement weather, call the Park at 301-320-2330 after 3 pm for possible cancellation if the Park closes.*

Glen Echo Town Hall 6106 Harvard St., Glen Echo, MD:

Same as for Glen Echo Park, save that Harvard Street is the THIRD left off of MacArthur Blvd. After the traffic circle.

PLEASE NOTE: Park in the lot behind the hall, on University Drive, or on the east side of MacArthur Blvd, NOT on Harvard St.


