Oscar Brand, Folk Singer, Recording Artist, Songwriter, Guitarist, Bawdy Song Balladeer, Sea-Chanteyman, Broadcaster, TV Host, Emcee, Musical Composer, Playwright, Actor, Author, Storyteller, Musicologist, Historian, Children's Recording Artist, Curator (Songwriters Hall of Fame), and Honorary Ph.D, appears in an FSGW Special Event at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, Falls Church, VA, Saturday, September 15 at 8 pm.

What he will sing at a concert is almost anybody's guess, because his repertoire is so vast. He may not have been around when *Auld Lang Syne* was written, but he's had a front row seat for most folk music in the past six decades. Come meet and hear a great singer, troubadour, and producer who has been at the center of folk music, possibly from since before you were born.

Born in Winnipeg, Canada, Oscar graduated from Brooklyn College, joined the U.S. Army in time for World War II. In 1945, he began presenting what is now the oldest continuous radio show in history, the award-winning "Folksong Festival" on New York Public Radio (WYNC), where he hosted Woody Guthrie, Ledbelly, and the Weavers, gave Arlo Guthrie a chance to play *Alice's Restaurant* for the first time on radio, and continues to champion folk music among the newest crop of talents. Brand, the Curator of the Songwriters Hall of Fame and author of seven books, has recorded 90 LPs, written songs for singers from Doris Day to the Smothers Brothers, and the Mormon Tabernacle Choir. Reading a list of the awards he's gotten could run beyond all the time in a typical concert.

Directions: From Beltway (I-495) in Virginia, take exit 50B for US 50 (Arlington Blvd.), east-bound toward Arlington. Drive past four traffic lights. Just before the fourth light (Graham Road) you will pass a McDonalds on the right; stay to the left and turn left at the next intersection, Woodlawn Avenue. Coming outbound (West) on Route 50, Woodlawn Avenue is a mile and a half past Seven Corners, on the right. The church is on the corner where you turn. Turn left into the parking lot of the church and enter on the Woodlawn Avenue side.

Metro: Take the Route 1A bus from Ballston Metro on the Orange Line, and get off at Woodlawn Ave.

Jeff Glassie and Julie Littell invite you to their home in Brookmont, Maryland (on the Potomac, downriver from Glen Echo), to hear **Steve James and Del Rey**, two inventively great guitarists who mix genres with talent and style.

Steve James, songsmith and bottleneck guitarist from Austin Texas, is "a true Americana hero...his intensity and focus always

reminds me of James Coburn's character in *The Magnificent Seven*" (Third Coast Magazine).

Del Rey, from Seattle, Washington, is a complex, pianistic guitarist, described as "a combination of Bo Carter and the Andrews Sisters" (*Observant Fan*).

These two powerful exponents of American vernacular guitar-playing have joined forces to make music which is a testament to the hillbilly/smarty-pants/country blues aesthetic. Sharing a sense of humor and a similar manic intensity, their duets are smart, funny and full of instrumental virtuosity. Del Rey doubles on resonator ukulele and Steve James is known for his "noble savage" mandolin style.

With nine solo albums between them, they have recorded a two cds together, *Tonight* (2004) and *Twins* (2002). They have enjoyed critical acclaim for their work with singer Maria Muldaur as well. They channel Memphis Minnie and Kansas Joe (plus Joe's mandolin playing brother, Charlie McCoy) on her 2005 release *Sweet Lovin' Ol' Soul*.

"Their inventive chops are jaw-dropping and amazing, and they both pay healthy respects to the masters of old without losing their collective musical identities, which embrace a host of old-time genres" (Bruce Willey, *Santa Cruz Good Times*)

What **Mike Agranoff** does as a folk musician is a rather difficult question to answer. He plays a superb fingerstyle guitar in idioms ranging from ancient harp tunes to obscure Tin-Pan-Alley compositions. His concertina arrangements of music by anyone from Bach to Berrymans may be haunting, complex, exciting, but are, above all, musical.


Of course, if you've been around the folk scene at all in the Northeast, you've probably seen him. He's that tall lanky guy with the once-reddish beard gone greyer than he'd like to admit. And when the music starts, he's in the middle, adding to the chorus and probably knowing all the lines. His repertoire is not only varied, but vast.

Mike is not only a collector of songs and a master at arranging them, but is also a writer of songs and recitations. He has a keen ear for the best of the best, and this only enhances his own writing. If you're sick of the endless stream of singer songwriters who write for the market, you will find Mike to be a refreshing alternative. He makes us laugh, cry and think, all the while entertaining us long into any evening of music.

Because one of the few things Mike likes to do more than sing is to get other people to share their songs, the concert portion of the evening will be followed by a sing-around. Bring songs to share!



We go so late on Sunday night that we'll serve breakfast on Monday morning if you want to stay for it. We even have a kitchen available to ourselves at all hours, equipped with

refrigerator, freezer and microwaves, if you need an in-between snack.

The West River Center features many places to make music, in groups large and small.

There are 50 bedrooms in 6 buildings. All beds have comfortable mattresses (bring your own pillows, bedding, and towels). We'll give you a discount if you'll volunteer for an upper bunk. There's handy flush plumbing and hot showers (with separate mens and womens facilities in each building).

Most buildings are handicapped accessible. If you cannot handle an upper bunk, or have further special needs, let us know on the registration form. If you wish to bring a tent or an RV, you may do so and guarantee your privacy, but there are no hook-ups, and you'll have to pay the same fees as those occupying a room, because that's what the camp charges us.

We have rates for one, two, or three nights, and one for day-trippers who don't want to eat. (You MUST register in advance if

you wish to dine!)

The weekend starts Friday evening with a potluck dinner. If you register for two nights, your registration fee covers three meals and a midnight snack both days on Saturday and Sunday. Three-night registration gives you an additional night's lodging and breakfast on Monday morning. One-night registration gives you all meals and snacks on either Saturday or Sunday and, if you wish, a bed on either adjacent night.

There is NO SMOKING is allowed in any of the camp buildings. Because it's a camp run by the Methodists, we are asked not to bring any alcohol.

West River is a 19 miles South of Annapolis. Folks coming from Virginia and the South get off the Beltway onto Pennsylvania Avenue (MD4) near Camp Springs (Exit 11). Folks from the Northern suburbs of DC go out Route 50 to Annapolis and then South for about 19 miles. From Baltimore and BWI, I-97 leads south to Annapolis, and for folks from Delaware, New Jersey, and points North, you can go south in Delaware and cross the Bay Bridge (US 50) at Annapolis to bypass Baltimore. It's within an hour's drive of most of the D.C. area (your mileage may vary).


