

NASA's Goddard Space Center. Some have become standards in the folk world. You probably know some. They're sung at song swaps, in bars and by other noted singers and songwriters in major concert halls.

**David** is funny. His songs are life-affirming. He sings about sitting on **Jimmy Durante's** knee as a kid, about favorite teachers and recyclable grocery bags, about how **Manuel Garcia's** family and friends reacted to his chemo-induced baldness, about finding a building contractor – and becoming a carpenter, and about singing the National Anthem in a sports arena. **David Roth** writes from the headlines and from the heart.

# Len Graham Memories of a Lifetime **Saturbay, Movember 8 · 8 pm** Len Graham offers traditional songs in English from the North of Ireland,

his native Ulster, along with memories from a lifetime of collecting and singing. Len's extensive repertory of songs covers the gamut of themes and human experience as portrayed in the old ballads, local songs, come-all-ye's, lyric folksongs, music hall pieces; songs on politics, murder, love, emigration and more.

From Mullaghbawn, Newry, County Armagh, Northern Ireland, Len Graham was born into an Antrim family steeped in traditional music, song, and dance. He is one of the foremost performers and collectors of Ulster music. A recipient

of numerous awards and accolades, he uses traditional songs to pass down Ulster's history to contemporary audiences. A professional singer since 1982, he has been the source of traditional songs for many of Ireland's leading performers, including Altan, The Chieftains, De Danann, and Dolores Keane. Graham toured many years with the brilliant storyteller John Campbell, who died in 2006. Len Graham last performed in the DC area at the 2007 Smithsonian Folklife Festival on the Mall as part of the Northern Ireland program. 

His passion, his lilting voice and his true mastery of vocal technique make him one of the finest interpreters of Irish song. **Dónal's** current project is a multimedia program about the Michael Davitt, one of the most influential figures of 19th Century Irish history. Maguire traces the life and times of Davitt

through song and story, words and music. Whether singing unaccompanied or accompanying himself on guitar or mandolin, Maguire commands attention as he recreates the lost experience of eviction, emigration and hardship. The program includes songs of land and labor, love and politics from the Irish and English folk-traditions, all rendered with gusto and passion.

# Large Studio Space Available at Glen Echo Park Request for Proposals: South Arcade Studio

The Glen Echo Park Partnership for Arts and Culture, Inc., requests proposals from nonprofit organizations or artists to develop and provide arts or cultural programming in Glen Echo Park's South Arcade Studio, a newly renovated facility within a historic National Park. The South Arcade Studio is a large ground level facility, located at one end of the Arcade building (47' x 38.5' for approximately 1,810 square feet, ceiling height 20'). It is adjacent to one anchor tenant, Adventure Theatre, and in close proximity to other resident groups. The space may be well suited for industrial arts or organizations seeking a space to fit out uniquely as their own.

This facility is offered in base condition and will be available for occupancy in January 2009. Tenants will be required to fit out the space as appropriate for their program needs. 

Glen Echo Park, MD • Spanish Ballroom/Bumper Car Pavilion

7300 MacArthur Blvd. At Goldsboro Rd., Glen Echo, MD

#### FROM THE BELTWAY:

Maryland Side: at 2-lane Exit 40 take the left fork for the Cabin John Parkway. Where Cabin John merges with the Clara Barton Parkway, move into the left lane, under the overhang. <u>Then follow instructions in MD&VA, below.</u>

**Virginia side**: Get into the far right hand lane at the top of the bridge. At the first fork, bear right. Stay in the left lane; watch for Cabin John traffic merging from the right at the overhang. <u>Then follow instructions in MD&VA, below.</u>

**MD&VA**: Watch for signs to MacArthur Blvd. Make a very sharp hairpin turn and move immediately into the right lane. At the T intersection/stop sign, turn left onto MacArthur Blvd. The Upper parking lot is on the left. For the lower parking lot, go around the small traffic circle and make the first left onto Oxford St. <u>Be SURE to come to a COMPLETE STOP at the Stop Sign!!!!</u>

By Public TRANSPORTATION: Take the #29 Bus from the Friendship Heights Metro Station. Ask the driver to let you know when to get off for Glen Echo Park. The bus stops running before the last dance ends. Ask the dance coordinator to announce that you need a ride. We've never left anybody at the Park. Last bus leaves Friendship Heights Metro at 7:30 pm.

#### Glen Echo Town Hall

#### 6106 Harvard St., Glen Echo, MD:

Same as for Glen Echo Park, save that Harvard Street is the THIRD left off of MacArthur Blvd. After the traffic circle. *PLEASE NOTE:* Park in the lot behind the hall, on University Drive, or on the east side of MacArthur Blvd, **NOT** on Harvard St.

#### Washington Ethical Society (WES) Auditorium,

7750 16th St. NW, DC just south of the intersection of Kalmia Rd. and 16th St, about four blocks inside the DC/MD line.

#### FROM THE BELTWAY:

Take the Georgia Ave. South exit (29 south). Stay in either right line. Go .4 miles from the exit ramp, going south on 16<sup>th</sup> St. South. Follow 16<sup>th</sup> Street past the light at East-West Highway (Rt. 410); go straight at the circle at the DC/MD line. Kalmia Rd. is the second light after the DC/MD line. WES is the second building on the right after Kalmia Rd. Parking is on Kalmia or 16<sup>th</sup> St.

**By METRO:** Red Line to Silver Spring Stop. Walk south on Rt. 29 Colesville Rd. to the traffic circle at 16th – go left down 16th four blocks to Kalmia Rd. and WES. If you'd rather not walk, an S-4 Metro Bus will deliver you to the corner of Kalmia Rd. and 16th.
