The Mother Jongue Project

Saturday, April 21 · 8 pm

With blazing fiddle solos, African and Brazilian percussion, and group sing-alongs, **Ilusha Tsinadze** and his band reimagine Georgian folk music. For the first time, they place the folk songs and dances of Georgia's villages and mountains into conversation with the sounds of the global city. *Deda EnalMother Tongue* is their recently recorded album, one that has earned them acclaim internationally. Joining **Tsinadze** for this performance will be the personnel from the record, some of New York City's finest improvisational musicians: **Rob Hecht** (violin), **Richie Barshay** (percussion), **Liam Robinson** (accordion), **Chris Tordini** (bass), and **Jean Rohe** (voice).

Ilusha Tsinadze came to the U.S. with his family at the age of eight, and didn't return to Georgia until 2005, by which time he had earned a bachelor's degree in jazz guitar. There, he rediscovered the musical heritage lost to him for so many years. It became a bridge between cultures and lands, between his family in Georgia and himself.

Ilusha became inspired to share the music of his heritage with an audience in the U.S. He settled in New York, but rather than combing the diverse New York City music scene for Georgian traditional musicians, he opted to call on some of his accomplished friends from the worlds of jazz, American roots music, and international music.

Sparky and Rhonda Rucker perform throughout the U.S. as

well as overseas, singing songs and telling stories from the American folk tradition. **Sparky** is internationally recognized as a leading folklorist, musician, historian, storyteller, and author and accompanies himself with fingerstyle picking and bottleneck blues guitar, banjo, and spoons.

Rhonda Rucker is an accomplished player of harmonica, piano, banjo, and bones player, and also adds vocal harmonies to their songs.

Expect an evening of toe-tapping music spiced with humor, history, and tall tales. Sparky and Rhonda take their audience on a journey that ranges from poignant stories of slavery and war to an amusing rendition of a Brer Rabbit tale or their witty commentaries on current events. Their music includes a variety of old-time blues, slave songs, Appalachian music, spirituals, ballads, work songs, Civil War music, cowboy music, railroad songs, and a few of their own original compositions.

Sparky and Rhonda have performed at the Kennedy Center in Washington D.C. and the Smithsonian Folklife Festival as well as public radio's *On Point, Prairie Home Companion, Mountain Stage*, and *Morning Edition*. Their recording, *Treasures & Tears*, was nominated for a W.C. Handy Award, and their music is also included on the Grammy-nominated anthology *Singing Through the Hard Times*.

Martin Grosswendt, once described by U. Utah Phillips as "a rumor

in his own time," has been a presence on the folk and traditional music scene for more than three decades. A multi-instrumentalist and powerful singer long known for his skill as an interpreter of 1920s and '30s blues, he is equally at home playing the old-time country music of the Southern Appalachians or the Cajun and Creole music of Southwest Louisiana.

Martin began his career at the age of 16 as a session musician at Vermont's Philo Records, supplying Dobro and guitar

with another stellar album.





Learning directly from recordings is an important skill and some newer audio software has made it much easier.
