JOHN ROBERTS AND JEFF WARNER ONLINE • SUNDAY, OCTOBER 24 7 PM | CONCERT STARTS AT 7:30

Join us via Zoom for the new FSGW concerts season, kicking off with two of this country's greatest delvers and interpreters of traditional music, John Roberts and Jeff Warner.

John Roberts

was born in Worcestershire, England, but came to the United States to go to graduate



school at Cornell, where he met his longtime musical partner Tony Barrand. Their love of music making enticed John away from his academic field, and he became one the great finders and singers of traditional music from both Britain and America. Sometimes a cappella, or accompanying himself with the anglo concertina or banjo, his encyclopedic knowledge of songs is second only to his skill at making memorable performances.

Jeff Warner comes by his performing and interpreting of American traditional music from his upbringing as the son of Frank and Anne Warner, two of America's most renowned folksong collectors. He plays concertina, banjo, guitar and several

"pocket" instruments, including bones and spoons. His songs from the lumber camps, fishing villages, and mountain



tops of America connect 21st century audiences with the everyday lives–and artistry–of 19th century Americans. Not only does he inhabit his songs, but he sets them into historical and social context, a habit learned in his youth.

Each of these two artists will have a chance to play off the ideas and performances of the other. Expect a **sing-around** afterward, and we've invited our performers to join us.

Additionally, every participant agrees to abide by the rules & regulations of the event, which are subject to change as conditions warrant.

FSGW Getaway Weekend Online • Friday, October 8 – Monday, October 11

Once again, FSGW will gather on-line instead of in real life for the Getaway, its annual singing weekend, from Friday noon on October 8 through Monday evening October 11. A combination of the ongoing COVID-epidemic plus the ease of joining friends from all over the world who have no travel hassles has convinced us to stay on the Zoom platform.

Register for the weekend at <u>http://www.fsgw.org/Getaway</u> — it's easy—we only need your name, e-mail address and how to contact you. We'll also ask where you're from, because lots of folks dwell in other time zones. A complete schedule can be found there in many formats, although the schedule is always subject to change, right up to the end of the weekend. A few sessions will require an additional registration—there are concerts on Saturday and Sunday evenings, and you can sign up for a performance slot in advance. There are two special workshops—a vocal clinic with **Ken Schatz** and a slide-guitar techniques masterclass with **Elly Wininger**—and if you'd like to volunteer to be worked with, you should sign up in advance for those; there is no need to sign up in advance if you just want to learn by watching. Lastly, we have an exciting event designed for children called Summerquest, led by **George Rathbone**, and you'll want to sign up in advance for that, including your snail-mail address so we can send you a packet of real-life stuff to use for the quest.

Expect an extravaganza of participatory singaround sessions, mini-concerts, instructional workshops, storytelling, children's activities, evening sign-up concerts, and presentations on topics of interest – all coming to you on Zoom! If you're insecure about Zoom, rest easy – there will be an instructive session on Zoom available both before and during the weekend.

Here are just a few program highlights:

• A presentation on the History of the Blues, with **Pete Kraemer** and **Phil Wiggins**. There will also be a blues singaround, led by **Eleanor Ellis** and **Mike Rocke**; a "What Makes It the Blues?" guitar workshop with **Elly Wininger**; and a miniconcert by **Rick Franklin**.

• A session of harmony singing – Duets, Trios, and Beyond, hosted **Darriel and Jocelyn Day**. Since Zoom doesn't do well with long-distance harmonizing, we're hoping those of you who can gather in one room to sing together will come and satisfy our hunger for harmony.

• A singaround session of Maritime Songs

chanties, forebitters and more – led by
Geoff Kaufman and Deirdre Murtha; a presentation on the Multicultural Roots of
Sea Chanties, with the expertise of Bob
Walser, Bonnie Milner, and Stephen
Sanfilippo. And Julia Lane and Fred
Gosbee (Castlebay) will bring us a selection of songs from Julia's new book of Maine sea songs.

• A whole Saturday afternoon of ballads, led by balladeers like Saro Lynch-Thomason, Lisa Null, Colleen Cleveland, Lorraine Van Buren, Tim Radford, Julie Henigan, and Sally Rogers, plus one more chance Monday afternoon, led my Michael and Carrie Kline. • We'll get lots of laughs with singarounds on Parodies, led by Joe Hickerson and David Diamond, and Humorous Songs, led by Steven Levine and Murray Callahan.

• For kids, we'll have a session of Songs for Children, with **Kim Wallach** and **Deirdre Murtha**. In addition, there will be a kids' treasure hunt, "Summerquest," with

Getaway favorite George Rathbone, consisting of three sessions on consecutive days. Young ones ages 6 and up should register in advance for this, so George can send them materials.

• Instrumentalists will enjoy several sessions: **Rob Van Sante** and **Allan Carr** will demonstrate and give pointers on that percussive guitar style typical of such British artists as Martin Carthy; and John Roberts and Bill Destler will help us

all with tips on accompaniment in "How to Play Well with Others."

• If you're looking for help with singing, you'll want to check out **Ken Schatz's** Vocal Clinic. Ken will personally coach four preregistered singers, and the rest of us can watch and learn.

• Devotees of Irish and Irish-American music will find a lot to love, with several singarounds, led by such wonderful singers as **David Ingerson, Amelia Hogan, Connie McKenna, Melissa Weaver Dunning, Peter Brice,** and **Brian O'hAirt.** We'll also have a mini-concert by **Thomas McCarthy**, and a presentation on the amazing variety of Irish musical styles by David Ingerson.

• For those interested in the spoken word, we have a lot to offer: a session led by **Don Stallone** where you can present poems, recitations, and other spoken pieces, plus a whole track of storytelling from artists who perform regularly with The Grapevine.

There will be much more – Labor Songs, Gospel, Chorus Songs, Trades and Occupations, Classic Country, a Songwriters' Showcase, Songs of Social Justice, Songs of the Supernatural, American History Songs, a Quiet Sing, Scottish Songs, Old-time, and a chance to show off your pandemic songs with "2020 Hindsight," just to name a few. And there will be appearances by, among many others, **Bruce Baker, Larry Hanks, Magpie, Janie Meneely, David Jones, Cecilia Eng,** and **Jeff Warner**.
