First up is the dynamic duo of Elke Baker and Larry Unger. Elke combines lyrical melodies with driving dance rhythms in her energetic fiddling; Larry is a renowned musician on the guitar, banjo, and more, whose tune compositions are widely played at contra dances everywhere. Together, they make a combination that is not to be missed.

Calling the dances is Diane Silver of Asheville, North Carolina, known for

Next up, all the way from Boston, is Kingfisher, featuring Cecilia Vacanti on fiddle and Jeff Kaufman (of Free Raisins fame) on mandolin, keyboard, drums, and more. Playing both traditional and contemporary contra dance music, Kingfisher has been hailed as one of the most versatile up-and-coming contra dance bands on the road today.

Bob Isaacs of Princeton, New Jersey, beloved among dancers everywhere as a choreographer and caller of innovative and complex dances, will call the figures.



Finally, **Live Wire** is an exciting band from the Philadelphia area featuring Berklee School of Music graduate Tom Krumm on fiddle, second-generation dance musician Bill Kennedy on keyboard, and longtime staples of the contra dance scene Bill Quern on banjo, mandolin, and melodeon and Sarah Gowan on guitar. This group lights up the dance floor with their varied and energetic tunes.

Local favorite Janine Smith will bring us home with her legendary sense of humor and irrepressible love of music and dance.

This new trio act features a unique collaboration between 3 of the best known names in traditional Irish music: **Cillian Vallely** on uilleann pipes, **David Doocey** from Co. Mayo on fiddle, and **Dave Curley** on guitar and vocals.

Armagh native Cillian Vallely has established his name over the last decade through his playing with award-winning trad Irish supergroup Lunasa. Influenced by the rhythmic, flowing style of Paddy Keenan and Johnny Doran, Vallely's mastery of chanter, drones and regulators has earned a reputation as one of the top players in the tradition. He has performed with acts as diverse as Bruce Springsteen, Riverdance, Natalie Merchant,

Mary Chapin Carpenter & Tim O'Brien.

He has also recorded on over 70 albums including seven with Lunasa, his acclaimed solo debut "The Raven's Rock", "Callan Bridge" with his brother Niall, "On Common Ground" with Kevin Crawford. **David Doocey** from Co.Mayo is at the forefront of a younger generation of Irish musicians. He has won several awards for his outstanding fiddle playing including the All-Ireland Fleadh, the first ever World Fleadh fiddle championship in 2005 and the much coveted Feile Oriel trophy. **Dave Curley** is a multi-instrumentalist, singer and songwriter from Galway, Ireland. He is a member of

award winning Irish trad bands "One for the Foxes" and "Slide".

FSGW Presents a Rare Opportunity to Hear Scholar, Singer and Irish Guitar Virtuoso **Julie Henigan.**

Julie Henigan, known internationally as a scholar and singer of Irish and Ozark folksongs, and as the author of two definitive books on Irish-style guitar, will be making some rare appearances in our area. Though her schedule has not yet been finalized, Julie will be appearing at the FSGW Getaway (Sept. 29 – Oct. 2). At the Getaway, Julie will present a mini-concert, a workshop on The Songs of the Ozarks, and she will co-host a workshop on Medieval and Renaissance Music with Kevin Elam.

After the FSGW Getaway, she will appear in the Silver Spring MD area at an all-Irish house concert on October 6 and will present a Traditional Irish Song workshop on October 7. She will finish off her mini-tour of the DMV on October 8 with a house concert in Alexandria VA. Julie performs unaccompanied ballads, old-time banjo numbers, instrumental dance tunes, guitar originals, and traditional songs in Irish Gaelic. She plays guitar, five-string banjo, lap dulcimer, and fiddle for both song accompaniment and solo instrumentals.




