John Doyle

MUSICIAN, SINGER, SONGWRITER, PRODUCER

returns to the Lyceum with traditional songs and those he has composed, from his new album:

Free by Nature: Songs of the Irish in the American Revolution.

In a catalog of the most notable recordings and performers in Irish music, **John Doyle** pops up again and again. Liz Carroll; Eileen Ivers; Karan Casey; **Solas**; Michael Black; Mary Black; the trio of McCusker, McGoldrick and Doyle; **The Teetotalers** (Martin Hayes, Kevin Crawford, John Doyle); and now **Usher's Island** (Andy Irvine, Donal Lunny, Mike McGoldrick, Paddy Glackin and John Doyle)—a veritable who's who of the greatest names in Irish music. These are just a very few of the stellar artists for whom John Doyle's signature guitar sound, singing or songwriting is essential.

As a member of **Solas**, John performed to sold-out audiences nationally and internationally as well as appearing on many national TV and radio programs. As part of that critically acclaimed group, he received three NAIRD awards and a Grammy nomination for the band's self-titled first recording.

After leaving **Solas**, John has gone on to perform and tour with other greats in the Folk, Celtic and Bluegrass worlds—as music director for folk icon Joan Baez, guitarist for Mary Chapin Carpenter, Eileen Ivers, Tim O'Brien, Linda Thompson, Kate Rusby, Cathie Ryan, *Cherish the Ladies*, and many others.

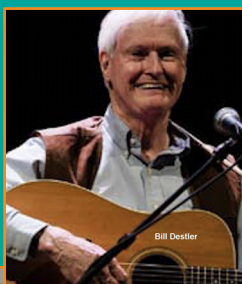

SMITHSONIAN FOLKLIFE FESTIVAL

GOES NATIONAL

FOR THE UNITED STATES' 250TH ANNIVERSARY

Culture Of, By, and For the People

To commemorate the 250th anniversary of the nation's founding, the Smithsonian is taking its oldest and largest public event—the annual Smithsonian Folklife Festival—on the road to communities across the country and three U.S. territories. *Of the People: The Smithsonian Festival of Festivals* will amplify how festivals serve as enduring tools for civic engagement and cultural exchange. By taking the Folklife Festival beyond Washington, D.C., the Smithsonian will join millions of people in their own communities to commemorate, celebrate, and contemplate this national milestone.

Between March and November, the Center for Folklife and Cultural Heritage will collaborate with approximately 40 festivals around the country, ranging from one-day events to weeklong gatherings.

The Center will also present a slate of **signature programs at the Smithsonian in Washington, D.C.**, including food and music demonstrations at the National Museum of American History and the Anacostia Community Museum. In the Arts and Industries Building, visitors can explore the Folklife Marketplace, featuring handcrafted items from American artisans, and a special exhibition showcasing objects and stories from past Folklife Festivals. The building will also host “For the Common Good: Smithsonian Voices on Our Shared Future 250,” a series of conversations with Smithsonian staff, community partners, and thought leaders.
